FYEP 190 courses are often cross-listed with an introductory-level discipline-based course. FYEP Inquiry Seminars (FYEP 190) introduce first-year students to the methods and topics of study within a particular academic discipline or field. These seminars focus on three main skill areas: literacy, critical reflection, and community.

BUSA 201-01, 201-02

Understanding business in the global marketplace and how functions and applications contribute to mission. Introduction to domestic and global economic, competitive, social, cultural, political and legal environments of the business enterprise, and how to integrate ethical and socially responsible behavior in the business environment. Opportunity to reflect on professional goals and explore potential careers in business. FYEP Inquiry Seminars (FYEP 190) introduce first-year students to the methods and topics of study within a particular academic discipline or field. These seminars focus on three main skill areas: literacy, critical reflection, and community.

CLAS 241-01

An opportunity to pursue in-depth such topics as late antiquity and the rise of Christianity, ancient medicine and technology, specific literary genres. May be repeated for credit with different topic. FYEP Inquiry Seminars (FYEP 190) introduce first-year students to the methods and topics of study within a particular academic discipline or field. These seminars focus on three main skill areas: literacy, critical reflection, and community.

COMA 101-02

Introduces the study of communication. Surveys the contexts and applications of study in these disciplines. Introduces the use of rhetorical theory as a means of understanding communication behavior. FYEP Inquiry Seminars (FYEP 190) introduce first-year students to the methods and topics of study within a particular academic discipline or field. These seminars focus on three main skill areas: literacy, critical reflection, and community.

DANC 362-01

Designed to introduce alternative therapies of mind-body processes. History, roots, practice, and cultural significances of several therapies and practices. Cross-listed with KINS 362. FYEP Inquiry Seminars (FYEP 190) introduce first-year students to the methods and topics of study within a particular academic discipline or field. These seminars focus on three main skill areas: literacy, critical reflection, and community.

ECON 101-03

Introduces the study of economic decision making by firms and individuals. Economic tools and concepts such as markets, supply and demand, and efficiency applied to contemporary issues. Students cannot take both ECON 101 and 111 for credit. FYEP Inquiry Seminars (FYEP 190) introduce first-year students to the methods and topics of study within a particular academic discipline or field. These seminars focus on three main skill areas: literacy, critical reflection, and community.

ENGL 217-02

A variable-content course that focuses on literature that fosters an awareness and understanding of diversity in the United States. Courses may be repeated for credit with approval of department chair. FYEP Inquiry Seminars (FYEP 190) introduce first-year students to the methods and topics of study within a particular academic discipline or field. These seminars focus on three main skill areas: literacy, critical reflection, and community.

GEOS 107-01

A survey of current climate change research. Students will develop and apply a fundamental understanding of earth systems through evaluation of geologic and other scientific evidence for long- and short-term climate change. FYEP Inquiry Seminars (FYEP 190) introduce first-year students to the methods and topics of study within a particular academic discipline or field. These seminars focus on three main skill areas: literacy, critical reflection, and community.

HIST 215-01

Surveys major features of the principal existing civilizations of the world since 1450: East Asia, India and southern Asia, the Middle East, Eastern Europe, Western civilization, sub-Saharan Africa, and Latin America. FYEP Inquiry Seminars (FYEP 190) introduce first-year students to the methods and topics of study within a particular academic discipline or field. These seminars focus on three main skill areas: literacy, critical reflection, and community.

PHIL 223-01

An examination of significant controversies in contemporary biomedical ethics, of major moral philosophies, and of their interrelationships. FYEP Inquiry Seminars (FYEP 190) introduce first-year students to the methods and topics of study within a particular academic discipline or field. These seminars focus on three main skill areas: literacy, critical reflection, and community.

SOCW 101-01

An introduction to human need and the field of social work. Provides an overview of services, models of service delivery, and professional social work values. Students visit agency settings and meet with social work practitioners. A volunteer experience in the field is a required component of this seminar-style course. FYEP Inquiry Seminars (FYEP 190) introduce first-year students to the methods and topics of
