CLEP Program - Pacific Lutheran University

The CLEP program is essentially credit-by-exam. Students can take exams in various disciplines and are awarded credit based on their score. CLEP exams are offered nationwide. The exams are in conjunction with the College Board and the American Council on Education (ACE). Go to www.collegeboard.com/clep for further information on test sites.

Students who wish to receive credit for CLEP exams must submit official score reports to the Registrar's office. Students may not take a course via CLEP for which they have already earned academic credit. A score report shows the student's exam score, the ACE recommended credit-granting score, and ACE recommended credits. PLU recognizes the ACE recommendations and awards credits accordingly.

There are two types of exams, general and subject. General exams are awarded elective credit only. Subject exams may count towards majors, minors, or General Education elements only if approved by the appropriate department. Contact the Registrar's office before taking a CLEP exam to ensure that the exam will transfer to the your academic record.
