

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This course—as an interdisciplinary combination of the Department of Art and Design and Women's and Gender Studies Program-examines how physical space and culture participate in the construction and maintenance of gender categories in Dubai. As an emergent center of commerce, global trade, and innovation, Dubai serves as a rich environment in which to examine how values and beliefs about gender and its intersection with other identity categories, such as race, religion, class, etc., are communicated in a place where traditional values and modern realities intersect daily. Students will explore Dubai, Sharjah and Abu Dhabi, analyzing how design informs one's understanding of gender in a country four decades old yet steeped in thousands of years of tradition.
