

Transitioning From Uedit to Google Sites

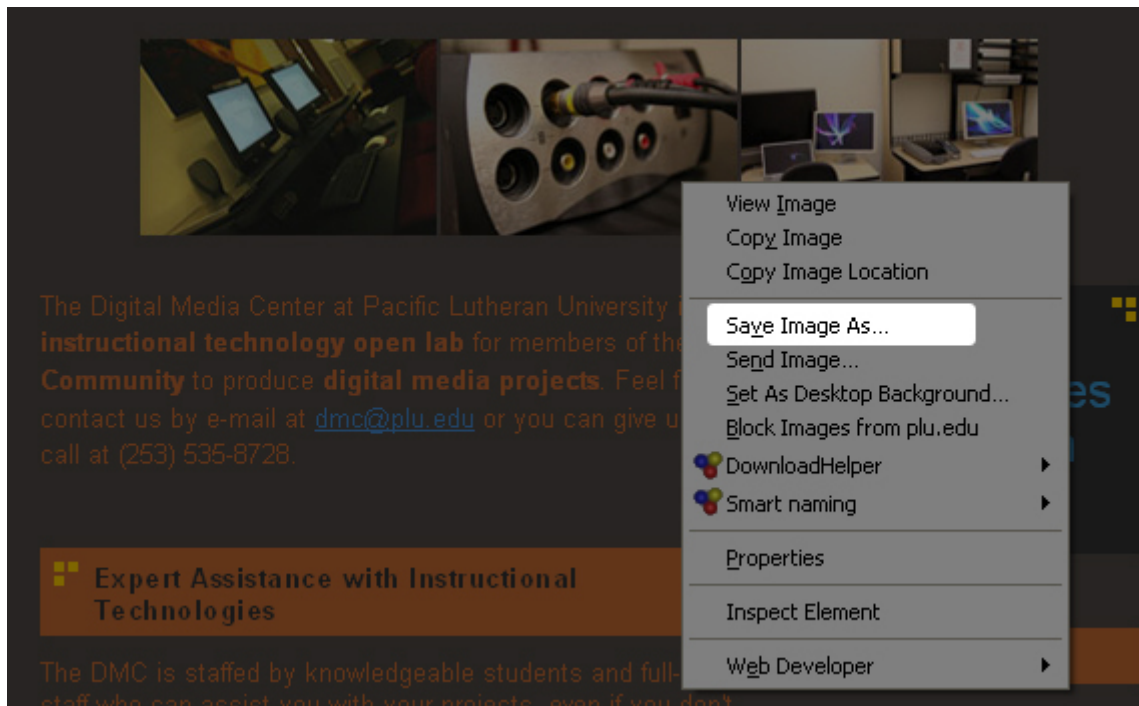
This quick guide will walk through the process of transferring a Uedit Page to a Page within Google sites.

Note: To complete this tutorial you will need to open each editor in a separate browser window or tab.

Archiving Images

If you are trying to replicate the layout of your Uedit page within Google's sites, you will need to manually move your images.

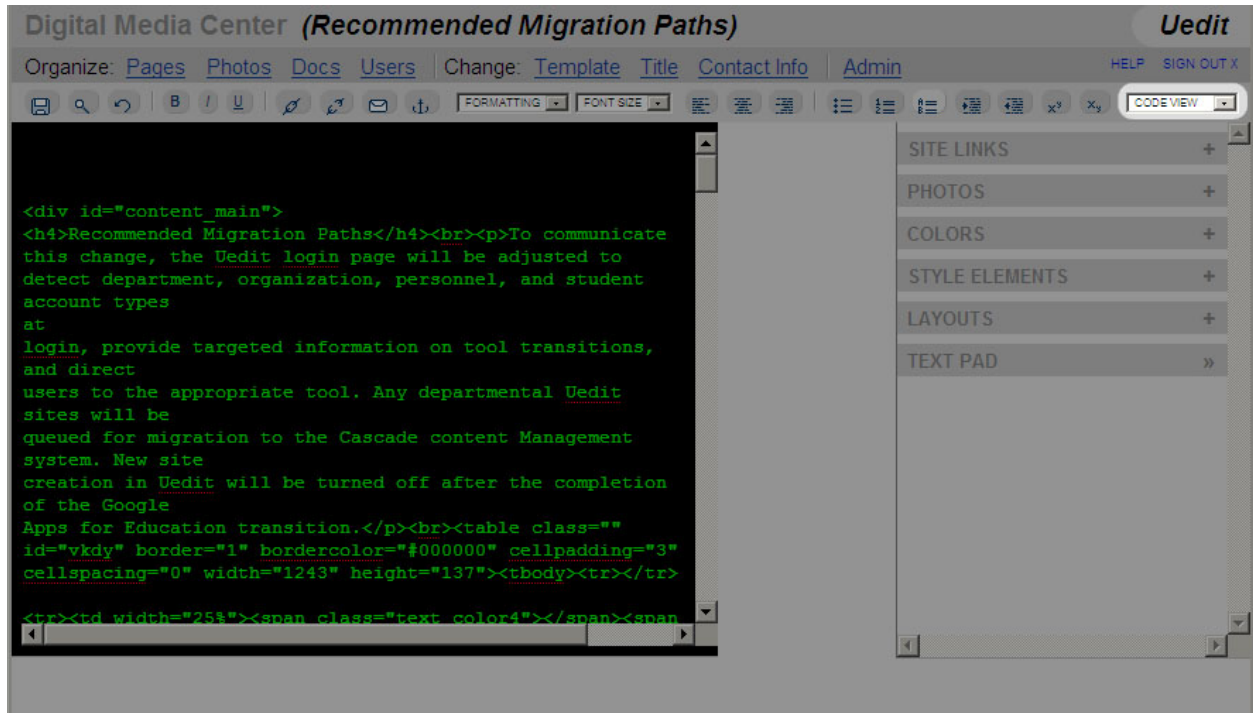
Open your Uedit page and download all your images to a folder on the desktop. Images can be Retrieved by right clicking and selecting "Save Image As".



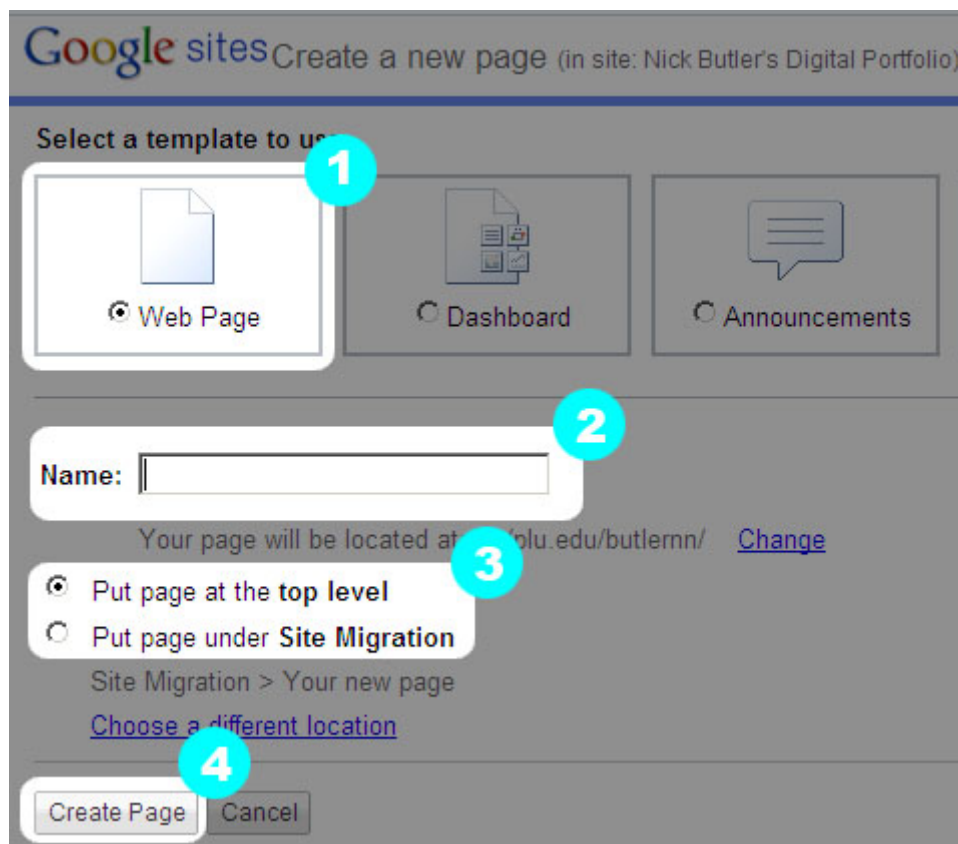
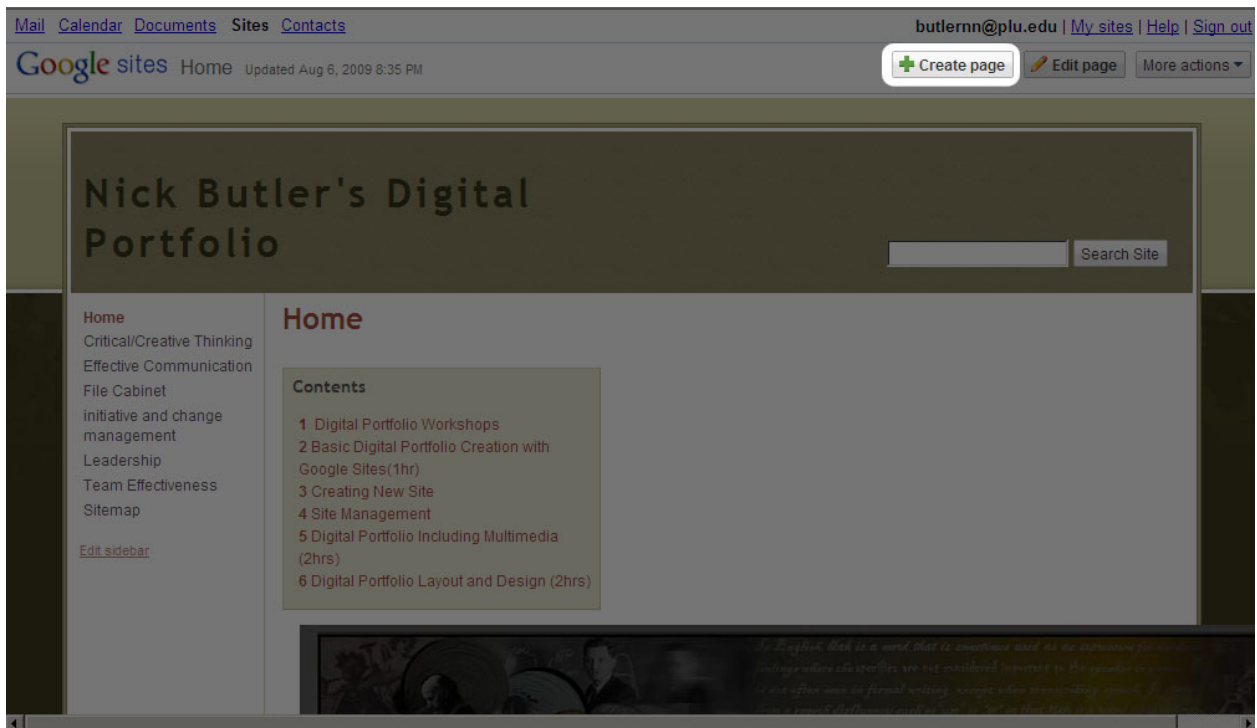
Save the image to your workfolder or somewhere you can easily find it. Repeat this for all the images you wish to move to your new site.

Transfer Text/Copy

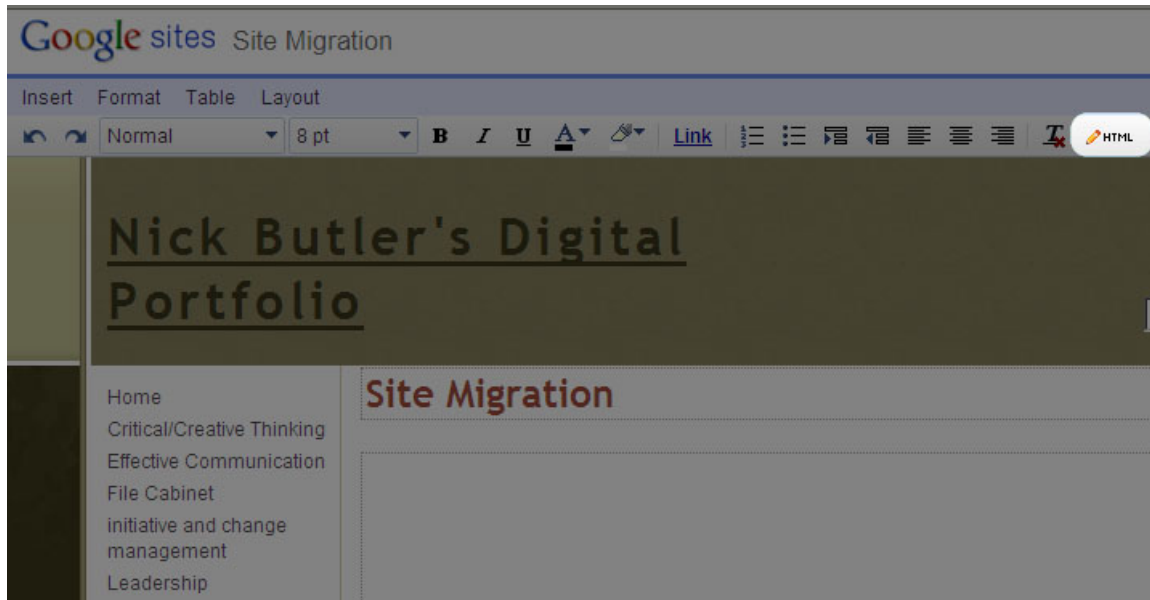
Inside Uedit switch to "Code View"



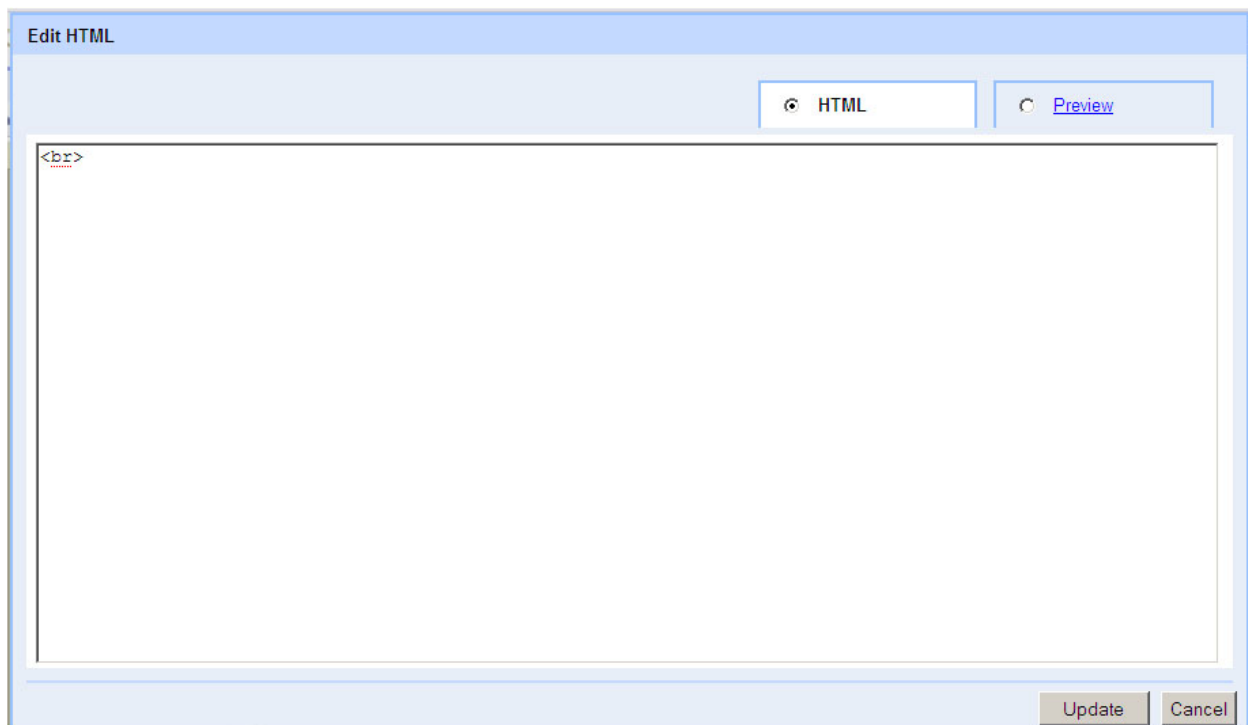
Inside Google sites create a new page



In the Page Edit view click HTML

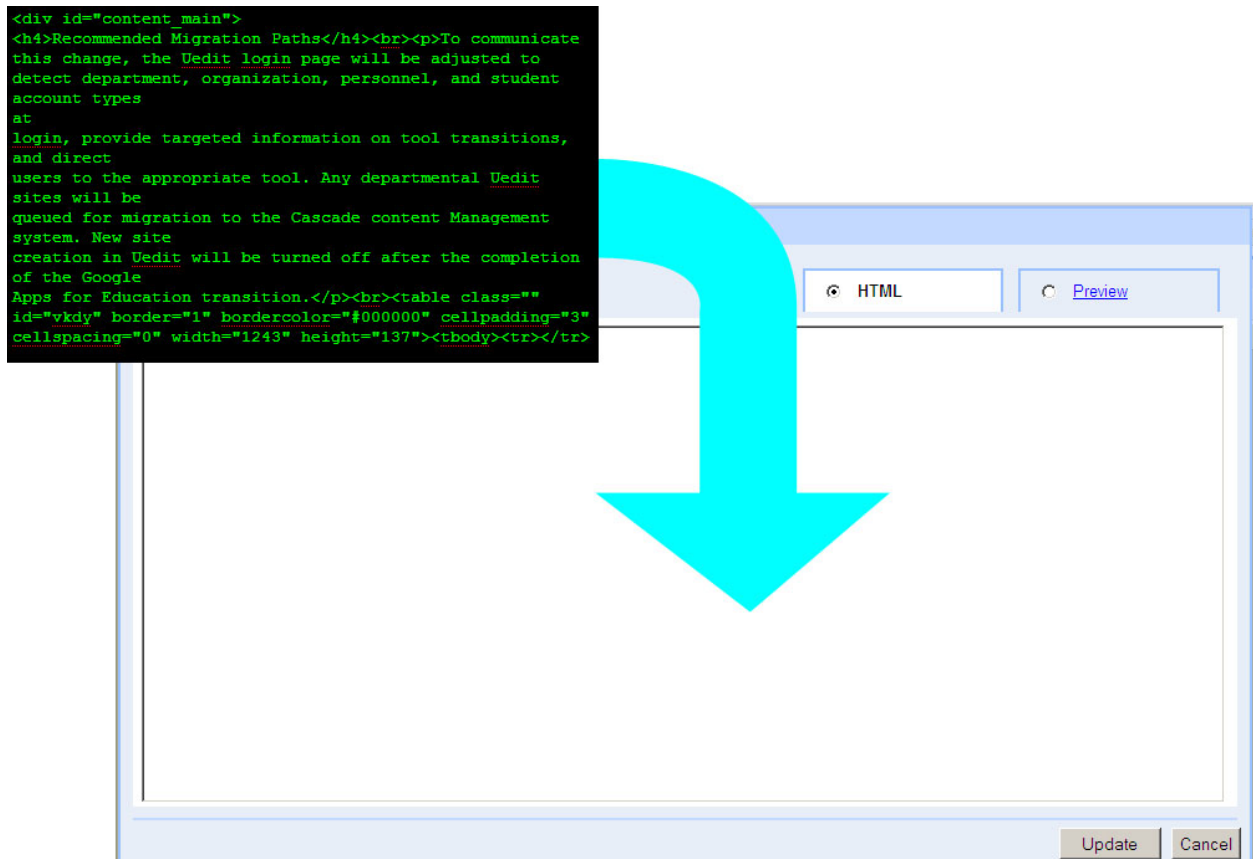


This will open the Google site HTML window the new page should only contain "
"
For best results delete the
 before pasting.



Copy the contents from the Uedit "Code View" by selecting the page content or by clicking into the code view and pressing CTRL + A, this will select all. Once you have all the content selected press CTRL + C, this will copy the content.

Paste this into the Google HTML window



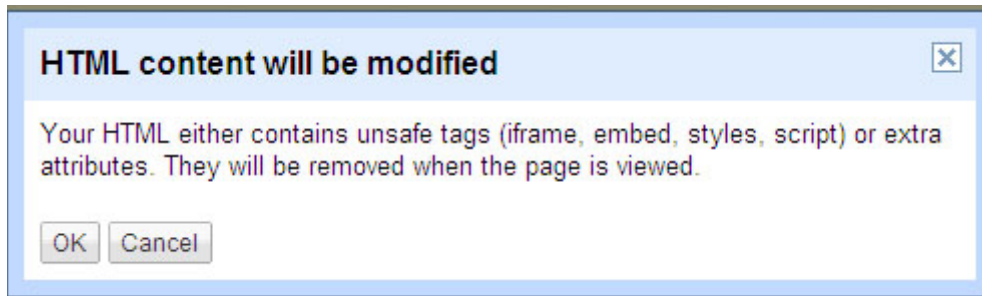
Next to HTML tab in the upper right corner of the Html viewer is a "Preview" tab. Click to see a preview of your page.

Click "Update"

You may get a warning that your content will be modified.

Google Sites will reformat the code removing particular tags and attributes.

Click OK.



Once your content is tranfered you may need to go back and restyle layouts and relink pages.
