The Master of Arts with Residency Certification Program helps to prepare pre-service teachers in their work to establish a socially just and responsible world. To facilitate this, the program encourages candidates to explore their vocation as teachers and to work for meaningful social change by recognizing the perspectives of the students and families in the communities they serve; by providing opportunities for powerful and authentic learning grounded in the living experiences of their students; by facilitating candidate inquiry into the formulation of critical educational questions; by honoring the vast array of cultural and linguistic resources in schools, classrooms and communities; and by modeling the skills, habits and ethical passions required for effective democratic citizenship. These program goals align directly with the department's core values of care, competence, difference, leadership, and service.

◆ **Classes begin June 15**

- ◆ The Elementary Program has 39 continuous semester hours from Summer 2009 through Summer 2010 at a program price of \$27,105 or \$695 per semester hour.
- ◆ Additional fees may include: Certification Fee, Thesis Binding, Copyrighting, Fingerprinting, Graduation Fee, Placement File, etc.
