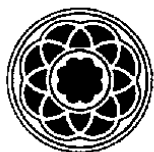

Admission Information

Pacific Lutheran University welcomes applications from students who exhibit capacities for success at the baccalaureate level. Applicants must present evidence of scholastic ability and demonstrate qualities of good character in order to be accepted for admission. Both the vice president for admissions and director of admissions reserve the right to admit, deny, or withdraw admission for any applicant/student based on an individual's meeting these criteria. Applications for admission are evaluated without regard to race, color, creed, religion, gender, national origin, age, mental or physical disability, marital status, sexual orientation, or any other status protected by law.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

Students who began their higher education at other regionally accredited colleges or universities are encouraged to apply for admission with advanced standing. Over 400 students transfer to the university each year with an average grade point in excess of 3.00 (B). Candidates must have good academic and personal standing at the institution last attended full-time. The minimum grade point average to be considered for admission as a transfer student is a 2.50 cumulative grade point average in college-level work from a regionally accredited institution. In reviewing an applicant's file, the Office of Admissions examines the grade point average, academic progress, essay, and recommendations. For applicants with less than sophomore standing (30 semester hours or 45 quarter hours), secondary school records and standardized test scores will also be considered.

*Minimum Entrance Requirements:

1. Two years of college preparatory mathematics (exclusive of computer science) with an average grade of C or higher, an approved course at the baccalaureate level, or demonstrated equivalent proficiency.
2. Two years of one foreign language in high school with an average grade of C or higher, or one year at the baccalaureate level, or demonstrated equivalent proficiency.

Note: Students who have not satisfied one or both of these requirements may still be admitted but must make up the deficiency as an additional degree requirement. Completion of the Direct Transfer Associate of Arts and Sciences degree does not waive the entrance requirements.

Transfer Credit

TRANSFER OF CREDITS FROM OTHER UNIVERSITIES

The Registrar's Office evaluates all transfer records and provides advising materials designed to assist students in the completion of university requirements. These materials include a summary of university-wide requirements completed and the total hours accepted. Individual schools and departments determine which courses satisfy major requirements.

1. Courses must be listed in the official college catalog, be a part of the regular college curriculum of a regionally accredited college or university, and be posted on an official college or university transcript.
2. College-level courses completed with a grade equivalent to C- or higher at other regionally accredited colleges or universities normally will be accepted for graduation credit as pass credit and will not be calculated into the PLU grade point average. Courses from all institutions are subject to course-by-course evaluation.
3. A student may transfer a maximum of 96 semester or 144 quarter hours. Of these, the maximum transferable from a two-year school is 64 semester or 96 quarter hours.
4. Students who complete the direct transfer associate degree from an accredited Washington state community college before matriculation at PLU will be admitted with junior standing and will have satisfied Core I of the general university requirements (GURs) except for 4 hours in Religion (from line one or two) and 4 hours in Perspectives on Diversity, which are unique requirements to PLU. All students must meet additional entrance and graduation requirements as specified in the catalog.
5. PLU does not give transfer credit for correspondence, on-line, or independent study courses in Literature, Philosophy, or Religion.
6. Your grade point average does not transfer in with you and will not be figured into your PLU cumulative GPA except when calculating honors at graduation.
7. Transfer classes must be a minimum of 4 quarter hours or 3 semester hours to fulfill a PLU requirement.
8. All community college credit transfers as lower-division credit regardless of upper-division equivalency.

- All courses from a community college are considered lower-division, regardless of equivalency.
 - 'X' indicates transferable credit with no specific PLU equivalent.
 - 4 quarter hours are required to fulfill a GUR, except PE.
 - '*' indicates courses less than 4 quarter hours. Course can be used in combination with another from same discipline to fulfill the GUR.

PLU DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

The General University Requirements (GURs) are required of all students earning baccalaureate degrees from PLU. Except where noted, no course may be used to meet more than one GUR.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS: Deficiencies in these requirements must be made up as soon as possible after entering PLU. Students entering in fall are expected to meet the language requirement in their first year.

- **Mathematics:** Two years of college preparatory mathematics (exclusive of computer science) with grades averaging C or higher, an approved course at the baccalaureate level, or demonstrated equivalent proficiency.
- **Foreign Language:** Two years of one foreign language in high school with grades averaging C or higher, one year at the baccalaureate level, or demonstrated equivalent proficiency.

FIRST-YEAR EXPERIENCE: The First-Year Experience requirement is comprised of three courses: Writing 101 Inquiry Seminar (4 hours); Inquiry Seminar (4 hours) and a J-term course.

- All three courses must be completed during the freshman year. This requirement must be met by all students entering PLU with *fewer than 20 semester hours*. A freshman writing course from another accredited college may substitute for Writing 101.
- Inquiry Seminars meet the First-Year requirement as well as a general university and/or major requirement.
- J-term courses meet the First-Year January residency requirement as well as a general university and/or major requirement.

SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS: These are required of all students, whether they elect Core I or II.

- **Mathematical Reasoning** (4 hours): This may also be satisfied by Computer Science 115, Statistics 231, or by the completion (with at least a B average) of the equivalent of four years of college-preparatory mathematics (through mathematical analysis or calculus or equivalent).
- **Science and Scientific Method** (4 hours): This course must include a laboratory component.
- **Writing** (4 hours): Freshman satisfy this requirement with Writing 101 Inquiry Seminar: Writing for Discovery as part of their First-Year experience. A freshman writing course from another accredited college may substitute for Writing 101.
- **Perspectives on Diversity: Alternative Perspectives** (4 hours): A course which creates an awareness and understanding of diversity in the United States, directly addressing issues such as ethnicity, gender, disability, racism, or poverty. *Cross-Cultural Perspectives* (4 credits): A course that enhances cross-cultural understanding through examination of other cultures. One of the two diversity requirements (but not both) may be met by a course used simultaneously to meet another GUR. Students transferring to PLU with junior standing must satisfy one of the two requirements at PLU with a course that does not fulfill another GUR. Each term, a list of all the courses offered that meet either of the diversity requirements is published at the front of the class schedule.
- **Physical Education** (4 hours): Four different activity courses, including Physical Education 100, are required. Activity courses are numbered from 150 to 259. Teaching methods courses or courses for PE majors may not be used. One hour of credit may be earned through approved sports participation.
- **Senior Seminar** (2–4 hours): as designated by the academic unit of the student's major.

CORE REQUIREMENTS: All undergraduate students must complete the requirements listed below for either Core I or Core II. Core I is a distributive core; Core II is a thematic, integrated core.

Core I Requirements (32 hours)

- **Art, Music, or Theater** (4 hours): Any course in art or music except teaching methods courses may be used, including music lessons and ensembles. Communication courses may not be used.
- **Literature** (4 hours): Any literature course from the English department may be used. Literature courses offered by the Department of Languages (including classics and Scandinavian studies) may satisfy this requirement. Correspondence, on-line and independent study courses are not accepted to meet this requirement.
- **Philosophy** (4 hours): Any philosophy course except logic or critical thinking courses may be used. Correspondence, on-line and independent study courses are not accepted to meet this requirement.
- **Religious Studies** (8 hours): Four credits must be taken from each of two of the three lines: (1) Biblical Studies; (2) Christian Thought, History, and Experience; and (3) Interpretive and Comparative Studies. Correspondence, on-line and independent study courses are not accepted to meet this requirement. Junior and senior transfer students must take one religious studies course from either line 1 or 2 at PLU.
- **Anthropology, History, or Political Science** (4 hours)
- **Economics, Psychology, Sociology, or Social Work** (4 hours)
- **Natural Sciences, Computer Science, or Mathematics** (4 hours)

Core II Requirements (28 hours)

Core II is known as the International Core: Integrated Studies of the Contemporary World. It is thematic and interdisciplinary in nature. Students may switch from Core II to Core I by requesting that the International Core Program Coordinator apply their International Core course credits to Core I requirements.

- **International Core 111 and 112** (4 hours each): Taken in the first year, this pair of courses lays the groundwork for the 200-level courses that follow.
- **200-level International Core courses** (16 hours): These topical courses vary somewhat from year to year.
- **One 300-level International Core course** (4 hours).

COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES REQUIREMENT: In addition to meeting the entrance requirement in foreign language, candidates in the College of Arts and Sciences (all BA, BS, BARec, BAPE, and BSPE degrees) must meet option I, II, or III below:

- **Option I:** Completion of one foreign language through the second year of college level. This requirement may also be satisfied by completion of four years of high school study in one foreign language or by satisfactory scores on a proficiency examination.
- **Option II:** Completion through the first year of college level of a foreign language other than that used to satisfy the foreign language entrance requirement. This option may also be met by satisfactory scores on a proficiency examination.
- **Option III:** Four semester hours in history, literature, or language (at the 201 level, or at any level in a language other than that used to satisfy the foreign language entrance requirement) in addition to courses applied to the general university requirements; *and* 4 semester hours in logic, mathematics, computer science, or statistics, in addition to courses applied to the general university requirements.

201 level language courses used to satisfy Option I and language through 102 used to satisfy Option II may also be used to satisfy the Perspectives on Diversity requirement in Cross-Cultural Perspectives.

OTHER DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

A minimum of 40 semester hours must be completed from courses numbered 300 or above.

A minimum of 128 semester hours must be completed with a grade point average of 2.00 (2.50 in the Schools of Business and Education).

44-Hour Rule: Not more than 44 semester hours earned in one department may be applied to the BA or BS degree.

Senior Residency: The final 32 semester hours of a student's program must be completed in residence at PLU.
