#### General Degree Requirements

- A minimum of 128 semester hours must be completed with a GPA of 2.00 or higher.
- In addition to the requirements of this major, students must complete all other requirements of the University as listed in the catalog.
- At least 8 semester hours for the major must be taken in residence at PLU.

#### Music Major - Bachelor of Arts in Music

- Requires 44 semester hours in music plus an outside cognate.
- To be admitted into the program, students must audition before the music faculty. This is done at scholarship auditions, ensemble placement auditions at the beginning of fall semester, or at juries at the end of the first semester.
- Placement into Music Theory & Analysis, Ear Training, and Keyboarding Musicianship is done by assessment.
- Students should declare the music major during their first semester at PLU.
- Only grades of C or higher in music courses may be counted toward the major.
- Majors must maintain a 2.50 cumulative grade point average in academic music courses (private lessons and ensembles excluded) to remain in the program (see department handbook).
- Keyboard Proficiency: For students pursuing the B.A. degree, attainment of adequate keyboard skills is determined by successful completion of MUSI 152: Keyboard Musicianship II, with a grade of C or better.
- Annual Degree Assessments: Students will have their progress and potential assessed at the end of the first, sophomore, junior and senior years. Assessments are made by the music faculty via progress reviews, juries and public presentations. Outcomes are pass/fail; students who fail an assessment will not be allowed to continue in the music program (see department handbook). Ensemble required every semester (except for study-away semesters). For the BA in Music program, 4 semesters must be taken for 1-credit. Other semesters may be taken for 0-credit.
- Degree requires 5 credits in Private Instruction. Extra semesters may be required to meet scholarship requirements.
- Degree requires an outside cognate, either a minor or second major.
- BA in Music students must fulfill the following College of Arts and Sciences requirements:
- Language Requirement (Options I or II) (one year of language)
- Non-music arts elective course in visual arts, theatre or dance. Program requires no hours of music electives.
