I asked every person in my unit - no one had ever heard of the Director of Vocational Reflection (They thought it was the Wild Hope person). I know the Lutheran Studies chair does the 1x year conference. What else do these releases contribute? Could they focus more on recruiting majors or assessment (or be eliminated all together?)
