This letter serves as formal notification and official record of action taken by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) at its meeting on July 8-11, 2025, concerning the Spring 2025 Evaluation of Institutional Effectiveness of Pacific Lutheran University.

Commendations

The Commission commends Pacific Lutheran University for:

- 1. For successfully instilling the ideals and values of its mission and Lutheran Higher Education, which are embraced throughout PLU by the administration, faculty, staff, and students.
- 2. For establishing Automatic Admission Partnerships with local school districts and implementing the 253 PLU Bound Scholarship, which have expanded undergraduate admission pathways and significantly increased the recruitment of first-generation, Pell-eligible, and students of color.
- 3. For its development and implementation of a comprehensive institutional strategic planning process which has fostered a spirit of innovation, transformation, and change.
- 4. For its intentional focus on improving retention rates through institution-wide efforts and strategic initiatives, including a thoughtfully structured and effective set of new student orientation and first-year experience programs for undergraduate students.
- 5. Its development of robust dashboards that are used extensively by leadership teams to guide strategic planning and support data-informed decision-making.
