NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION

New Student Registration is a vital step in the start of your journey as a PLU student! During New Student Registration, you'll meet virtually with a PLU advisor to review your Fall 2021 class schedule and learn more about academic expectations and your path to graduation. We'll also provide you opportunities to connect with Student Financial Services, the Office of Accessibility & Accommodation, Residential Life, Dining Services, and other PLU resources.



1 Register for your PLU ePass email account (The confirmation email for your appointment will be sent **only** to your PLU student email)

2 Complete your Online Payment Agreement at plu.edu/payment-agreement

Please note - the Online Payment Agreement is not where you pay your PLU bill, but rather lets us know how you plan to pay any net cost owed to the university (i.e. monthly payment plan; yearly payment plan; financial aid covers all cost; etc.)

3 Take the required Math Placement Evaluation*

4 Complete the New Student Registration digital form*

Once you have completed the above steps, your advisor will email you to schedule your individual meeting. Please note that **you must complete all of the steps** before we can schedule your registration appointment!

June 1 is the Priority Deadline to sign up for New Student Registration.





Prepare for your appointment

You MUST complete the following steps at least **one week before** your appointment. If these steps aren't complete, your student account is put on hold and we can't register you for your Fall 2021 classes.

1 Complete the Meningococcal Release Acknowledgment*

This step MUST be done before your appointment or your student account will be put on hold and we can't register you for your Fall 2021 classes.

2 Complete the Learning Community Application at plu.edu/residential-life/protected/housing-application

The Learning Community Application must be completed by all students - you'll share your Learning Community (housing) preferences, and indicate where you plan to live (on- or off-campus)

3 Take the Language Placement Evaluation* if you plan to take language courses or are planning to major in English.

BUYING YOUR TEXTBOOKS



Once you've got your fall classes, you can start buying the textbooks needed for each class. The easiest way to buy textbooks? Go to *lutelocker.com* and select "Textbooks" from the menu at the top. When you reach the order page, select the term (Fall 2021), subject, then the class title and section for each of your classes.

The Lute Locker is also where you get all of your black and gold Lute gear (hoodies, t-shirts, hats, accessories, etc.)! Order online or visit the Lute Locker when you're on campus.

STUDENT EMPLOYMENT

Work Study FAQs

- **Q** Where on campus can I use my work study?
- A All on-campus jobs are work study eligible. There are offcampus options too.
- **Q** I don't have work study. Can I still work on campus?
- A Absolutely! On-campus jobs are open to all students.
- **Q** If I don't work my first semester or even first year, will I lose my work study?
- A You won't. You must, however, complete the FAFSA every year to be considered for work study eligibility.

Student employees are valued in every department on campus. Jobs for work study and non-work study in those departments, as well as off campus, are open to all students.

Once you're on campus, plan to meet with a Study Away Advisor in the Wang Center for Global and Community Engaged Education to help you plan the best experiences for your interests.

PLU is a globally focused university that remains committed to providing safe and high quality study away programs. The COVID-19 global pandemic has disrupted domestic and global travel, which has impacted the ability of PLU students to study away, yet we are hopeful conditions will improve allowing study away to resume safely in the near future.

At this time, the PLU Wang Center for Global and Community Engaged Education is accepting study away applications for J-Term 2022.
