New Student Registration

To officially become an enrolled PLU student, you'll meet with a PLU advisor during New Student Registration this summer to **register for your fall classes**.



HOW TO SIGN UP FOR NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION

Before you can sign up for New Student Registration, you'll need to complete the online "Registration 101" modules. You'll receive access to the modules once you've claimed your PLU ePass (PLU email) – check the 'Next Steps' checklist* on your PLU student applicant portal at choose.plu.edu/portal/myapp.

*Note: Most of the items on your Next Steps checklist will need to be completed BEFORE your New Student Registration appointment, so it's important to work on those and keep track of your progress!



WORK STUDY FAQS

- Q Where on campus can I use my work study?
- A All on-campus jobs are work-study eligible. There are off-campus options too.
- Q I don't have work study. Can I still work on campus?
- A Absolutely! On-campus jobs are open to all students.
- Q If I don't work my first semester or even first year, will I lose my work study?
- A You won't. You must, however, complete the FAFSA every year to be considered for work-study eligibility.




STUDENT EMPLOYMENT
