New Student Registration (NSR) is where you **get your fall class schedule** and officially become an enrolled PLU student!

During NSR (choose from an in-person or virtual appointment), you'll meet with a PLU advisor to register for classes, review your class schedule, and learn more about academic expectations and your path to graduation.

We'll also connect you with other campus departments to help you with additional next steps:

HOW TO SIGN UP FOR NEW STUDENT REGISTRATION

There are some **important steps** you **MUST COMPLETE** before you can sign up for NSR and register for fall classes.

BUYING YOUR TEXTBOOKS

Once you've got your fall classes, you can start buying the textbooks and/ or materials needed for each class. Go to **lutelocker.com** and select "Course Materials" from the menu at the top, which will direct you to the online resource to order what you need.

The Lute Locker is also where you get all of your black and gold Lute gear (hoodies, t-shirts, hats, accessories, etc.)! Order online or visit the Lute Locker when you're on campus.

WORK STUDY FAQS

- **Q** Where on campus can I use my work study?
- A All on-campus jobs are work study eligible. There are offcampus options too.
- **Q** I don't have work study. Can I still work on campus?
- A Absolutely! On-campus jobs are open to all students.
- Q If I don't work my first semester or even first-year, will I lose my work study?
- A You won't. You must, however, complete the FAFSA every year to be considered for work study eligibility.



OFFICE OF ACCESSIBILITY AND ACCOMMODATIONS

The Office of Accessibility and Accommodations

(OAA) is dedicated to ensuring equitable access and inclusion for all PLU students and serves students with either temporary or permanent physical, health, learning, sensory or psychological disabilities to establish reasonable accommodations and services. Reasonable accommodation is provided at no cost to the student on a case-by-case.

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Mental health care has long been a topic of importance at PLU, even before the COVID-19 pandemic. PLU was one of the first universities to adopt 24/7 telehealth and virtual medical and

mental health services with Lute Telehealth in early 2020. The program ensures students have access to providers—mental health and health—who share their identities and ensures that mental health resources are available to students at any time,

whether they are on campus or in another location.

I think it's important that people know that they're not alone. That sounds cliche. but it's so true. I feel like a lot of people are still living in isolation because that's what they're used to and that's what they've been accustomed to. I'm hoping that through our care packages and through all the work the university is doing, they're able to see that they have a community here and that people care about them. 🔽
