HOW TO APPLY

IT'S FREE TO APPLY TO PLU*

PLU ACCEPTS APPLICATIONS FOR A **FALL SEMESTER START** OR **SPRING SEMESTER START**

For transfer admission, you'll need one year (30 semester or 45 quarter hours) of college-level coursework and a college-level GPA of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale. If you have less than one year of transferable credit, you will also need to submit an official high school transcript or equivalent.

WHAT TO SUBMIT

- Online undergraduate application
- Personal Essay
- Academic Recommendation
- Official college transcripts (includes military and IP/AB transcripts)

International students whose first language is other than English must also:

- Have completed two quarters or one semester college-level writing course(s) with a B or better
 or
- Submit a TOEFL (79) or IELTS (6.5) or PTE (56) score
