A reminder about the process:

- 15-18 minutes presentation plus 2-minute Q & A
- Business attire
- Use visuals, provide evidence (we recommend a Power Point format with embedded pictures and even video clips. However, use another format, such as Prezi, if that works better for you.)
- Speak from your heart
- You will present individually and will be evaluated by the level of detail in your responses and your use of student evidence that supports your stories and transformation.
- There are three parts that must be addressed in the presentation:
  - **Transformation from ITE to you as a teacher:** Talk about the transformation from your ITE to where you are now as a teacher. Your ITE video is available for you and should be a part of your presentation. You will show this as a clip, and then I suggest you juxtapose that with a clip from your TPA to show a pre/post.
  - Strengths and challenges as a teacher and next steps moving forward: As a first year teacher, what are your strengths, challenges and next steps (goals) as you move forward in your career? Provide supporting evidence such as video clips, lesson plans, assessments, etc.
  - Compelling stories from your teaching that highlights who you are as a teacher: Describe 1 or 2 compelling stories from your teaching that highlights who you are as a teacher. Based on the work you started in EDUC 332, how do these stories represent your larger pedagogical beliefs and vision about teaching and learning.
