CONDUCTORS

Richard Nance, Choir of the West



Richard Nance is Director of Choral Activities and conductor of Choir of the West, University Singers and Choral Union. Dr. Nance's choirs have been recognized as some of the finest in the United States, and have been selected to perform at several regional and national conferences of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA), the National Collegiate Choral Organization and the National Association for Music Education. Nance has led choirs on ten international tours, where they have enjoyed great success at festivals and competitions. His choirs have taken part

in important premieres, including Sven-David Sandström's *Matthäuspassion* and the *Nordic Light Symphony* by Ēriks Ešenvalds. Nance has served as the Washington State and Northwestern Division President of ACDA. Several of his compositions have been published by Hinshaw and Walton Music, and in 2002 he was selected to compose the prestigious Raymond W. Brock commissioned work for ACDA.

Brian Galante, University Chorale



Brian Galante is Chair of the Department of Music and Associate Director of Choral Activities. He conducts the University Chorale. Dr. Galante received a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of North Texas and his Master of Music and Bachelor of Music Education from Louisiana State University. Choirs under Dr. Galante's direction have offered invitational performances in Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center, New York; the Meyerson Symphony Center, Dallas; Notre Dame Cathedral and Sacre Coeur, Paris; the 2010 Washington Music Educators Association conference; the 2011

Northwest MENC Conference; and the 2012 Northwest Division ACDA Conference. In addition, Dr. Galante is a successful composer and arranger: published by Galante Music, Walton Music, and Colla Voce Music; performed by professional, collegiate, and advanced high school choirs throughout the United States and Europe; and recorded for commercial release by Centaur Records, MSR, and PLU Media Services. He is Past President of the American Choral Directors Association Northwest Region.

Jeffrey Bell-Hanson, University Symphony Orchestra



Jeffrey Bell-Hanson is in his twentieth season as Music Director of the Symphony Orchestra and Professor of Music. Since arriving in the Pacific Northwest in 2002, he has become a familiar presence as a conductor, clinician, adjudicator and orchestral educator. Each year he works with school orchestras at all levels throughout the region and beyond, bringing to them the perspective of his long career as a conductor and a scholar. Dr. Bell-Hanson has conducted orchestras and wind ensembles throughout the United States and in Bulgaria and the Czech Republic, including the

West Bohemian Symphony Orchestra, the Olympia Symphony, the Marquette Symphony Orchestra, the Vratza Philharmonic, and the Philharmonia Bulgarica. His long career on the podium and as a teacher has also included faculty appointments in Kansas, Louisiana, and Michigan. Dr. Bell-Hanson is currently serving as Immediate Past President of the College Orchestra Directors Association.

ORGANIST

Paul Tegels



Paul Tegels, a native of the Netherlands, is Associate Professor of Music and University Organist at PLU. He received his Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in Organ Performance and Pedagogy and his Master of Arts Degree in Choral Conducting from the University of Iowa, where he studied organ with Delores Bruch and choral conducting with William Hatcher. Other degrees and awards include the Artist Diploma and the Master of Music Degree in organ performance from the New England Conservatory in Boston, where he studied with Yuko Hayashi and William Porter. He is the recipient of a

Fulbright Scholarship from the Netherlands-America Commission for Educational Exchange. He holds teaching and performance degrees from the Stedelijk Conservatorium in Arnhem, The Netherlands, where he studied organ with Bert Matter and harpsichord with Cees Rosenhart. He has done extensive research on the organ and harpsichord concertos of Franz Joseph Haydn, and has played the first American performance of the Haydn Organ Concerto in D, Hoboken XVIII-2, of which he has prepared a performance edition. He has also performed extensively in solo and ensemble concerts in the United States, Europe, Japan and New Zealand, and appears frequently in duet concerts with organist Dana Robinson.
