



2018 Commencement Speaker Freeman A. Hrabowski, III



Freeman A. Hrabowski III has served as the president of the University of Maryland, Baltimore County since 1992. His research and publications focus on science and math education, with special emphasis on minority participation and performance. He chaired the National Academies' committee that produced the 2011 report, Expanding Underrepresented Minority Participation: America's Science and Technology Talent at the Crossroads. He was named in 2012 by President Obama to chair the President's Advisory Commission on Educational Excellence for African Americans.

In 2008, he was named one of America's Best Leaders by U.S. News & World Report, which ranked UMBC as the

nation's No. 1 "Up and Coming" university for six consecutive years (2009-14). For the past three years (2015-17), U.S. News ranked UMBC in the top ten on a list of the nation's "most innovative" national universities. TIME magazine named him one of America's 10 Best College Presidents in 2009, and one of the "100 Most Influential People in the World" in 2012. In 2011, he received both the TIAA-CREF Theodore M. Hesburgh Award for Leadership Excellence and the Carnegie Corporation of New York's Academic Leadership Award, recognized by many as the nation's highest awards among higher education leaders. In 2012, he received the Heinz Award for his contributions to improving the "Human Condition."

He serves as a consultant to the National Science Foundation, the National Institutes of Health, the National Academies, and universities and school systems nationally. Examples of other honors include receiving the prestigious McGraw Prize in Education, the U.S. Presidential Award for Excellence in Science, Mathematics, and Engineering Mentoring, and the Columbia University Teachers College Medal for Distinguished Service.

With philanthropist Robert Meyerhoff, he co-founded the Meyerhoff Scholars Program in 1988. The program is open to all high-achieving students committed to pursuing advanced degrees and research careers in science and engineering, and advancing underrepresented minorities in these fields.

Born in 1950 in Birmingham, Alabama, Hrabowski graduated from Hampton Institute with highest honors in mathematics. He received his M.A. (mathematics) and Ph.D. (higher education administration/statistics) from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Pacific Lutheran University

Pacific Lutheran University offers approximately 3,100 students a blend of academically rigorous liberal arts and professional programs. Founded in 1890 by Norwegian immigrants, PLU is a private university affiliated with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The university offers three pathways to academic distinction: global education and service to the world, robust student-faculty collaborative research and creative projects, and helping students discern meaning and purpose in their lives.

A central tenet of Lutheran higher education – and core to PLU's mission – is the emphasis on education for lives of service and finding one's calling, or vocation. To support students and faculty as they explore life's big questions and engage in fulfilling and meaningful work, the university established the Wild Hope Center for Vocation, originally through a generous grant

from the Lilly Endowment. A distinctively hopeful exploration, the search for vocation that faculty and students undertake together endures even in the face of the untamed and unpredictable nature of the world in which we live.

PLU is a member of The New American Colleges and Universities, a national consortium of 22 selective, medium-sized (2,000-7,500 students) independent colleges and universities dedicated to the purposeful integration of the liberal arts, professional studies and civic engagement. PLU combines a strong commitment to teaching in a highly personalized liberal arts residential environment with a diverse array of professional and graduate programs. Faculty and staff at PLU share a vision that links scholarship, teaching and service in fulfilling its mission. We seek to blend the classroom and community, coordinating theoretical

and experiential learning through undergraduate and graduate research, professional practice and internships, and community economic and social development projects in the region and around the world.

The first American university to have study away classes on all seven continents simultaneously, PLU is also the first private university on the West Coast to receive the prestigious Senator Paul Simon Award for Campus Internationalization. An honoree on President Obama's Higher **Education Community Service** Honor Roll, PLU hosts an Emmy Award-winning MediaLab; a MacArthur Award-winning detachment of Army ROTC; and more than 100 clubs and activities, including 19 varsity athletic teams in the Northwest Conference of NCAA Division III.

University Mace

For centuries in academic and ecclesiastical processionals, a mace has been carried by the marshal to symbolize the official opening and closing of a formal event.

The head of the mace has a descending dove, representative of the harmonious presence of the Holy Spirit within the learning community. At the base of the walnut staff is a silver pine cone, made from a casting of a cone from the PLU campus.

The cradle bears a plaque with the following inscription from Proverbs 4:7: "Wisdom is the principal thing: therefore, get wisdom; Yea, with all thy getting get understanding."



Designed and created by Tom Torrens, former PLU Artist in Residence, the mace was a gift of former President and Mrs. William O. Rieke and family, presented at Commencement 1976.





Symbol & Ritual

The Commencement ceremony is a celebration of the Pacific Lutheran University community and all it represents. It opens with the setting of the stage, including banners and symbols representing aspects of the University.

When the Academic Procession begins, the University Marshal carries the PLU Mace, representing the academic authority and independence of the University. The University Marshal is followed by the Ceremonial Banners.

The whole PLU community, in its rich diversity, participates in this celebration. As different groups of the PLU community process into the arena, the Ceremonial Banners are also posted, completing the stage.

Academic Dress

Academic dress has its origins in clerical dress of the medieval church. PLU adheres to the national standards of academic dress established in 1895 and maintained by the American Council on Education.


The significance of the apparel is indicated especially by

the sleeves and hoods. The bachelor's gown has pointed sleeves; the master's gown has long, closed sleeves; and the doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves and velvet trimmings.

Hoods are lined with the colors of the institution from which the individual received his or her degree. The colored velvet border of the hood indicates the faculty or field to which the degree pertains.

The lining of the Pacific Lutheran University hood carries the black and gold institutional colors.

The Centennial Bell



The Centennial Bell is located at the heart of the Pacific Lutheran University campus, across from the Karen Hille Phillips Center for the Performing Arts on the red-brick quadrangle known colloquially as Red Square and officially as Centennial Plaza.

Each year, on the first day of classes, the bell is rung to announce the arrival on campus of the new class and the beginning of the Convocation ceremony opening the new academic year. The ceremonial ringing of a replica of the Centennial Bell is repeated at the time of Commencement to announce the graduation of the class.

The Centennial Bell was dedicated on May 27, 1990, to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Pacific Lutheran University. It was a gift from the 11th President, Dr. William O. Rieke, and his wife, Joanne Rieke. The Centennial Bell and its replica were created by sculptor Tom Torrens, former PLU Artist in Residence.




Ceremonial Banners

The Luther Rose

Also known as the Luther Seal, this is the most recognized symbol of Lutheranism around the world. Martin Luther personally designed this coat of arms and used it from 1520 until his death in 1546. The banner precedes the University Pastor and symbolizes the University's Lutheran affiliation.





PLU's First Seal

This seal, with an image of Mount Rainier and the motto "Build for Character," was Pacific Lutheran College's first official seal. The 1942 catalog read: "The motto expresses succinctly the aim of the school." The banner precedes the Chair and other leaders of the PLU Faculty.



PLU's Second Seal

This seal was adopted when the institution resumed the name and status of a university in 1960; it appears on official university documents from 1960 to 2012. The design incorporates elements that symbolize the University's heritage and mission, including a "Chi Rho," an abbreviation of the first two letters of "Christ" in Greek; the book of knowledge; the lamp of learning; and an evergreen tree symbolizing the Pacific Northwest. The banner precedes the President's Council, made up of the Provost and the Vice Presidents of the University.



The Crowned Lion of Norway

The rampant crowned lion bearing a golden axe with a silver blade on a red background is the central element of the coat of arms of Norway. Dating from the 13th century, it is among the oldest state coats of arms remaining in contemporary use. The banner precedes the Chair and members of the Board of Regents and symbolizes the University's Norwegian heritage.



The Rose Window Seal

This is the official seal of Pacific Lutheran University. It represents PLU's historic Rose Window, located in the Ness Family Chapel at the top of the Karen Hille Phillips Center for the Performing Arts. The distinctive Rose Window represents the history and tradition of the institution, speaks to its Lutheran heritage and connects students of today with generations of alumni. The PLU Board of Regents officially adopted this seal on Oct. 14, 2012, replacing one that had been used since 1960. The banner precedes the President and symbolizes the authority of the University.



University Seal



The Pacific Lutheran University Rose Window Seal was officially adopted by the Board of Regents on Oct. 14, 2012, replacing the seal that had been in use since September 1960. The PLU seal appears on all official documents, including the diploma. The Rose Window design is the iconic symbol of the university, and was designed by former Director of Communications Paul Porter in 1975. Porter drew his inspiration for the seal from the

8-foot-diameter stained-glass Rose Window located above the entrance to the Karen Hille Phillips Center for the Performing Arts and acts as a backdrop for the altar in the Ness Family Chapel. The distinctive Rose Window represents the history and tradition of the institution and speaks to its Lutheran heritage, and is seen as a recognizable symbol that connects the students of today with generations of alumni.

The PLU Printer's Mark



This symbol designed by Pacific Lutheran University alumnus Sam Hosman '14 features the rhododendron, Washington's state flower, and heather, the national flower of Norway. It reminds us of our place and our heritage.

Graduation Honors

Candidates receiving graduation honors at Commencement wear the PLU Graduation Honors Cord (a single black, gold and white cord). To earn graduation honors, a student must have a minimum of 64 hours at PLU and a cumulative PLU grade point average of 3.50 for *cum laude*, 3.75 for *magna cum laude* and 3.90 for *summa cum laude*.

Graduation honors, as listed in the Commencement bulletin, have been calculated on the basis of courses completed through January Term 2018. Final graduation honors, listed on a student's official transcript and diploma, will be recalculated following the completion of the student's final term.

Participation in a Commencement ceremony and/or inclusion of a student's name in the Commencement bulletin does not indicate that a degree will be awarded. All degree requirements must be successfully completed by the term deadline for a degree to be awarded.

Faculty Citations

Claudia J. Berguson



Professor Berguson came to PLU in the spring 2002. She earned her Ph.D. in Scandinavian Literature and a Certificate in Critical Theory from the University of Washington and has two M.A. degrees: one in Intercultural Relations with an emphasis in International Education from Lesley College in Cambridge, Massachusetts and the other in Scandinavian Studies from the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis. She was the first endowed Svare-Toven professor, a position developed to promote the programs of Norwegian and Scandinavian Area Studies by making them more visible and integrated across campus and in the wider community, with a focus on contemporary issues. In that position, she focused her work on gender equality, peacebuilding and immigration. As part of

this work, she was a leader in the development of PLU's Peace Scholars program, established in 2011, which deepens students' understanding of peacebuilding, conflict and war. This program provides support for two students from each of the participating colleges and universities to form a 16-member group that studies at a seven-week peace seminar in Norway, attends the Nobel Peace Prize Forum and promotes peacebuilding efforts on campus. Professor Berguson is a consummate language teacher, whose patience, humor and even guitar-playing have helped many students get over their hesitation to speak the language. She looks forward to her retirement in Minnesota, and to continuing her engagement with literature and her practice of relaxing while fly fishing.

David Deacon-Joyner



Professor Deacon-Joyner served 18 years at PLU. He began his career as associate professor of music in 2000, arriving from the venerable jazz program at University of North Texas with a substantial record of teaching and scholarship. He was a double authority in performance (as a pianist, vocalist and arranger) and in the history of jazz and popular music (as a published author). Whether directing the university's Jazz Ensemble, teaching non-majors in one of the university's most popular courses (History of Jazz) or reluctant classical music majors in the required Jazz Theory Lab, his passion for jazz was palpable. Colleagues laud his efforts to provide classes with the experience of jazz in its natural environment (clubs, coffee houses, etc.). He matured the

relationship between KPLU and the PLU jazz program, made the Christmas Jazz Jam truly a professional experience for our students, and shepherded the Jazz Under the Stars into a summer treasure for our Tacoma neighbors. He was the "everything guy" for that and many other events: composing/arranging, producing, playing and emceeing without seeming to break a sweat. Every concert has been an effortless blend of serious jazz history and great jazz playing, from the standards of Ellington and Basie to the experimental charts of Snarky Puppy and PLU student compositions. Throughout his PLU years, he enriched the university and community through his infectious love of music, family and friends.

Peter Ehrenhaus



Professor Ehrenhaus retires after 20 years in the Department of Communication & Theatre. He earned his Ph.D. from the University of Minnesota. His teaching opened students up to their own possibilities as learners and scholars. He does not accept as a limitation that his students are undergraduates with perhaps only a nascent interest in the field. While meeting students where they are through examples and assignments in his courses, he also pushes them to find their voices, to hone their ability to write and speak, to critique the world around them, to ask good questions. He is one of the most recognized scholars in rhetorical studies in this country. He is considered a premier thinker on questions of race, race lynching, re-enactment, memorial, and media. He has

an exceptional ability to weave together theory and case study to illuminate an often difficult and painful truth. His commitment to understanding some of the most traumatic moments in our nation's history, to treating those moments with respect, to give the victims of race violence the kind of dignity in his writing that they never had in their lived experience, reveals a kind of scholarly activism that serves as a model for others writing in our discipline and outside it. His scholarship is an exercise in empathy. Prof. Ehrenhaus is a center of calm and reason and practicality. He has a near encyclopedic knowledge of film and music and wine. A gardener, a summoner of mojitos, and a writer of staggering talent, his presence will be missed.



Bea Geller



Professor Geller joined PLU in 1984. She completed her undergraduate degree from New York University Film School and a graduate degree in photography at Rochester Institute of Technology. In the course of her career at PLU, Professor Geller was able to expand the course offerings of the Art Department from basic black and white film development. Most notably, she was able to introduce color photography by working with her students to refurbish a color processor that had been discarded. She further expanded the curriculum to include digital photography and digital imaging processes, opening the door for new creative and professional possibilities for her students. Alongside her work as an educator and mentor, Professor Geller has maintained an active

and distinguished career as a photographer and artist. Her work has been exhibited widely, and at diverse venues, including the Tacoma Art Museum, Bellevue Arts Museum, the Whatcom Museum, and the Center on Contemporary Art in Seattle. She was granted a Creative Artist Project Award in New Jersey, and she was the winner of an Oregon State Arts Commission Public Art Award. In 2007, Professor Geller was selected for a Pierce County Portable Works Award. Professor Geller's latest work was created during her most recent sabbatical fittingly titled, "Finding Tacoma." Exhibited in the University Gallery this spring, this diverse body of photographic work offers insight into the city's changing environments, from the harbor to the suburbs, and captures the diversity of its people and culture. Her work at PLU has impacted majors in the Department of Art and Design as well as students from across campus.

Linda Gibson



Professor Linda K. Gibson joined the PLU School of Business in 1989 after earning her Ph.D. in Management from the University of Missouri-Columbia. She has left an indelible mark of dedicated teaching, robust scholarship, and stellar service. Her passion for human resource management, organizational behavior and career management has been shared with multiple generations of students. Dr. Gibson is the force behind the PLU Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM). Most recently, she has integrated into her teaching emerging neuroscience aspects of leadership and management. She is the recipient of the Wells Fargo Award for Excellence in Teaching. The core question of Dr. Gibson's research is how managerial actions create sustainable

value. As a dedicated and productive scholar, she has made significant cross-disciplinary contributions to the advancement of knowledge and practices in creating sustainable value through organizational development, strategic human resource management, and environmental and other public policies. In honor of her commitment to teaching, research, and service, the PLU SHRM Student Association is creating the Linda K. Gibson scholarship, funded by the South Puget Sound SHRM Professional Chapter, for students who are interested in taking the SHRM certification exam in their senior year. Professor Gibson is an honored colleague and friend who leaves a lasting legacy.

Joanne Lisosky



Professor Joanne Lisosky has always been a "destination professor," the kind of person students come to work with — she is, by nature, a recruiter and a magnet. She has told countless students they will be communication majors because they should and they have talent. She is the yardstick against which her students measure their professional and personal success and integrity. Prof. Lisosky is famous for asking forgiveness rather than permission. She is relentless in pursuing goals, and she is quite gifted at working around the margins of the system to get done whatever she needs done. She is subversive in the best way, an activist as a journalist and teacher, an innovative scholar and professional. She won the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences (NATAS) Silver Circle Award for outstanding

contributions to both the television industry and the community. She has been awarded three Fulbrights. She is an extraordinary leader in local, regional and national media organizations. She provides cover for students doing provocative journalism. She is brave, and she encourages others to be brave, too. When people are asked to think of her, they say "I can see her in my mind, colorful reading glasses balanced so she can look over them, notepad in hand, leaned in. She is earnestly asking a question, feverishly taking notes. She is a journalist, after all. She is curious. She is, even sitting still, on the move. She is a force."



Terry Miller



Professor Miller holds the Ph.D. in Nursing and Administration for Higher Education and an MSN in Adult Health from University of Texas. His Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) and BS in Zoology and Chemistry are from the University of Oklahoma. He served as a professor in the School of Nursing at PLU from 1998 to 2018 and as dean for the School of Nursing at Pacific Lutheran University from 1998 to 2014. During his tenure as dean, Dr. Miller led the School of Nursing in receiving initial Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) accreditation in 2003, establishing the entry-level MSN program in 2003, and developing a partnership with Oregon Health and Sciences University for the distance delivery of their Ph.D. program in 2005.

Dean Miller also established an exchange program with Alesund College in Norway and study-away programs with Chengdu University School of Traditional Chinese Medicine and with the University of Namibia. Under Dean Miller's leadership, the School of Nursing received its first Health Research Service Administration (HRSA) grants and Advanced Nursing Education Traineeships. When asked what he is especially proud of at PLU, Dr. Miller underscores his work with a great group of people for 18 years who worked to build the best BSN program in the state, as well as the first entry-level master's program. He laid the groundwork for PLU's Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program and made sure that graduates were well prepared to succeed over the long term. Most of all, he notes the opportunity to work with wonderful students, staff, and faculty at multiple levels, who taught him more than he taught them.

Eric Nelson



Professor Nelson began teaching at PLU in 1988, as a lecturer, but his time at PLU started when he earned a bachelor's degree in classics at PLU. He earned his M.A. and Ph.D. in Classics from the University of Washington, His students find him to be a gifted teacher who generates enthusiasm in the classroom and beyond. He is always on the cutting-edge of technology, such as creating online multimedia language exercises by writing his own code and script. He developed an innovative series of video podcasts, called iClaudius. The series included a mystery that took students all around Tacoma to solve it. This year, he has taken a lead role in organizing a new program in Medical Humanities, coordinating the work of colleagues from multiple departments in another

example of cross-disciplinary design that demonstrates the value and relevance of humanistic, literary, and historical scholarship in the contemporary world. Prof. Nelson is the author of many scholarly texts, and has also helped share his expertise with the wider public through publications and TV. Several notable examples include participating and consulting on documentaries for the Discovery Channel, including *Machines of Malice* and *Animal Gladiators*. He also wrote two Idiot's Guides: *The Complete Idiot's Guide to Ancient Greece*, co-written with Susan K. Nelson in 2005, and *The Complete Idiot's Guide to the Roman Empire*, published in 2002. Eric and his wife Susan look forward to the next stage of their life in retirement, particularly to enjoying the Puget Sound and glasses of wine on their boat.

Lenny Reisberg



Professor Reisberg received his bachelor's degree in education with minors in history and English from the University of Texas, his master's degree in special education from the University of Arkansas and his doctorate from the University of Kansas with a major in special education and a minor in language development. Throughout his 35 years at PLU, he helped thousands of teachers-to-be help support children with special needs. He can't venture to many of his favorite Pierce County restaurants without being stopped by educators who fondly remember his courses' relevance to their daily work as teachers. His teaching excellence was rooted in the value he placed on student feedback and the continuous improvements he made to his classes throughout his career.

Most recently, he taught pre-service teachers how to use instructional technology to increase student achievement. Another gift of Lenny's was a strong social conscience. Within the wider Tacoma community he served on boards and worked in a range of organizations devoted to improving the lives of children, especially poor children. Lenny was the university's obvious choice to be the first Jolita Benson Chair in Elementary Education in 2010. He skillfully used the Benson Chair to conduct research, host well received lectures and increase the education department's visibility in the community. The Hebrew term "tikkun olam," meaning "world repair," is a Jewish concept that highlights human's responsibility for fixing what is wrong with the world. Lenny embodied tikkun olam throughout his PLU career through his conscientious and caring teaching and presence. Local schools, the education department and the university are indebted to him for this.



Sylvia Hazel Higginson Wood



Professor Wood has served as tenured faculty member in the School of Nursing since 1999. She earned her MSN from the University of Kentucky. She has served as lead faculty and clinical instructor for the Maternal Child/Perinatal Nursing course in the BSN program. She also has provided essential women's health advanced clinical practice content with the Family Nurse Practitioner students in both the MSN and DNP programs. She has maintained an active midwifery practice since 1979, both as a member of the U.S. Army Medical Corps and in civilian practice. Her practice roles have included surgical nursing; pediatric medical nursing and head nurse; labor/delivery, postpartum, and newborn nursing; nursing supervisor; positions as head and chief nurse;

and nurse midwife. Professor Wood's accomplishments have been recognized through Army Commendation and Merit awards, the Murray State University Distinguished Alumni award, the AWHONN Distinguished Professional service award, and the NAACOG Best Scientific Paper on Obstetrics award. When asked what she is especially proud of at PLU, Prof. Wood stated: "One thing that has brought me great joy, and made me feel accomplished as a teacher, is having the opportunity to work alongside those I have taught. To have the privilege of being a colleague to nurses, nurse-midwives and professors who were once my students has truly been the pinnacle of my career. Although I recognize that their accomplishments are their own, I believe that having a part of their journey may truly be my greatest contribution."
