Program Cost Sheet Post-Masters to Doctor of Nursing Practice ARNP-Prepared



The 2021-2023 post-master's to DNP for ARNP-prepared nurses is 35 continuous semester hours from summer of 2021 to spring of 2023, with a **total tuition cost of \$40,180** or \$1,148 per semester hour. Actual coursework and length of study depend on gap analysis for transfer-in credits.

Tuition is based on a cohort model. Students must complete the program with their cohort to remain eligible for cohort pricing.

Additional fees include: technology fee (\$250/year), wellness fee (\$100/year), a one-time matriculation fee (\$200), books and materials for coursework.

Total Tuition: \$40,180 Nursing Program Fee: \$4,266 (Subject to change)

Additional coursework may be required based on coursework analysis (must meet the AACN DNP Essentials competencies)
