

How does ASPLU understand DJS?

DIVERSITY:

- Recognition and celebration of difference within our community including those who come from both marginalized and privileged identities.
- We understand the value of uplifting those within our community who have historically been silenced and erased by systems of oppression and power.

INCLUSION:



 Inclusion is defined as "involvement and empowerment, where the inherent worth and dignity of all people are recognized. An inclusive university promotes and sustains a sense of belonging; it values and practices respect for the talents, beliefs, backgrounds, and ways of living of its members" (<u>Ferris State</u> <u>University</u>).

How does ASPLU understand DJS?



JUSTICE:

 ASPLU is committed to interrogating and critiquing systems of oppression, power, and privilege; along with further resisting such hierarchies and institutions. We will work to better understand mechanisms rooted in oppression, power, and privilege, while further acknowledging the resulting consequences.

SUSTAINABILITY:



- We care for the earth and support regenerative, non-extractive systems that affect both human and non-human beings.
- We acknowledge the connection between the environment and people living in it
- Thus we will:
 - Act upon how our habits, and systems
 we support impacts the environment, as
 well as the people living in it, and work in
 communities to minimize the effects of
 our current choices on future
 generations.
 - Question the systems of extraction we support. While collectively working to replace them with regenerative systems.
 - Work to better understand how our choices affect the environment, and people living in it.

DJS AWARD

The DJS FUNd is a pool of money that each PLU student contributes to. Students can apply for money with a proposal and budget to initiate a DJS-centered project.
