2018 Move-Out Guide For Residence Halls

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Important Move-Out Information

This guide is intended to assist you in understanding the changes to trash and recycling collections throughout the university during move-out week.

Waste Diversion Department is choosing to close down Residence Halls recycling rooms, trash/recycle corrals and removal of trash totes to help minimize overflow of trash and recycling debris that has historically occurred during move-outs.

Residence Halls with inside recycling rooms: Recycling rooms will be locked once recycling dumpsters are in place outside of residence halls. Students will then need to place their recycling in the dumpsters labeled "RECYCLE".

Residence Halls with green trash totes outside of Residence Halls: Trash totes will be removed after Trash dumpsters arrive. Students will then need to place their trash in the dumpsters labeled "TRASH".

Residence Halls with recycling totes and trash dumpsters in fenced corrals: Fenced corrals will be locked after corral dumpsters and recycle totes have been emptied and Trash and Recycle dumpsters arrive on the university. Upon arrival of dumpsters, students will need to utilize Trash and Recycle dumpsters.

Move-Out Week Event Dates

Residence Halls with inside recycling rooms / trash totes outside

May 16th (Wed) and 17th (Thu) - Trash and Recycling dumpsters arrive.

May 18th (Fri) - Inside Recycling rooms locked, trash totes removed and Donation Bins placed in Residence Hall lobbies. Students to utilize dumpsters.

May 29th (Tue) - Trash and Recycling dumpsters picked up. Recycling rooms unlocked and trash totes returned to Residence Halls.

Residence Halls with recycling totes / trash dumpsters in fenced corrals

May 16th (Wed) and 17th (Thu) - Trash and Recycling dumpsters arrive.

May 18th (Fri) - Fenced corrals locked. Students to utilize dumpsters. Donation Bins placed in lobbies.

Tingelstad and Harstad Halls

May 29th (Tue) - Trash and Recycling dumpsters picked up. Fenced corrals unlocked after dumpsters picked up.

South Hall

May 31st (Thu) or June 1st (Fri) - Trash and Recycling dumpsters picked up. Fenced corrals unlocked after dumpsters picked up.

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Trash and Recycle Dumpster Locations

(Dumpsters will be labeled trash or recycling)

South Hall - Dumpsters are located to the left of the fenced corral in the parking lot.

Harstad Hall - Dumpsters are located behind the residence hall.

Tingelstad Hall - Dumpsters are located in the parking lot at the back entrance of the residence hall.

Pflueger Hall - Dumpsters are located on the basketball court (northwest side of the residence hall).

Stuen, Ordal and Kreidler Halls - Dumpsters are located in the walkway area between Ordal and Hong and just east of Kreidler.

Hong and Hinderlie Halls - Dumpsters are located between residence halls (in the grass area).

If dumpsters for Stuen, Ordal and Kreidler Halls get full, utilize the dumpsters between Hong and Hinderlie Hall

Glass receptacles will be positioned next to dumpsters for the disposal of bottles and jars. Only these items can go into the glass receptacles.

Wing Meeting Information

Below are some important bullet points the Waste Diversion Department would like conveyed to students during wing meetings:

- The blue donation drums in the residence hall lobbies are for student donation only. Students should not use the donation drums for taking personal items from their rooms to their vehicles. Moving bins are provided in each residence hall.
- NW Furniture Bank and Tacoma Rescue Mission collection drums will be inside all residence lobbies. Drums will be labeled for acceptable items to be donated.
- A PLU Dining utensil bin will be in each residence hall lobby for items that were removed from the dining facility.
- Pay attention to all dumpster signs (recycling or trash), recycle room signs (closed during move-out week) and fenced corral signs (closed during move-out week).
- If recycling dumpsters are contaminated with trash, dumpsters will have to be emptied at the landfill, defeating the purpose of recycling dumpsters and will result in a **lower university waste diversion rate**.
- If you have an item that you are unsure how to dispose of properly, contact the Waste Diversion Department. Please do not leave items outside of dumpsters or in areas where they do not belong.
