The goal is to build momentum and connection among faculty at different stages of exploring alternative grading, from the curious newcomer to the seasoned convert. Join us for an update on AI at PLU, starting with a review of our foundational Guiding Principles. The majority of the session will be a comprehensive walkthrough of a new suite of AI resources designed to support AI literacy for PLU faculty and staff. We will explore the public site for guidelines and approved tools, an internal training portal, and a dedicated Google chat space. Additionally, we will demo the new interactive AI Project Hub, built in AppSheet, which allows faculty and staff to discover and share practical AI use cases.

11:30 am - 1:00 pm | Centering Conversation in IHON and Beyond - Hauge Admin 209

Over the past four years, first-year IHON faculty have reoriented these general education courses (IHON 111, 112 and 201) around *conversation* -- not as a better way to deliver material, or even simply to boost student engagement, but as a skill or art which is valuable in itself. In these courses, we employ the resources of 5,000 year old human conversation to cultivate a wondering, questioning attitude towards what seems, at first, simply 'obvious.' Our goal is to produce a student confident and competent enough to risk 'putting their oar' into this expansive and inclusive human conversation (Our changed focus turns out to work very well for students arriving at PLU with widely varying levels of preparation and aptitudes, and it also works very well to address the challenges of teaching in an age when 'AI' use seems to have become a routine part of the academic work process.) But if tries to imagine educating a conversant, how does one know if one has succeeded? In this workshop, IHON faculty will share some of their experiences with this pedagogical experiment, and offer practical suggestions on what has worked. The workshop is particularly intended for current and future IHON 200-level faculty, who will want to know what students learn in the first year and might expect going forward. However, any interested PLU faculty are welcome to join us to share thoughts and ideas.
