What Are Unusual Circumstances?

A student with unusual circumstances is defined as a student for whom a financial aid administrator makes a documented determination of independence by reason of unusual circumstances and in which the student is unable to contact a parent or where contact with parents poses a risk to such student, which includes, but is not limited to, circumstances of:

- human trafficking, as described in the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (22 U.S.C. 7101 et seq.);
- legally granted refugee or asylum status;
- parental abandonment or estrangement; or
- student or parental incarceration.

In such cases a dependency override might be warranted based upon the student's individual circumstances. These conditions would also not disqualify a student from being a homeless unaccompanied youth or self-supporting and at risk of homelessness.

Unusual circumstances do not include:

- Parents refuse to contribute to the student's education.
- Parents will not provide information for the FAFSA or verification.
- Parents do not claim the student as a dependent for income tax purposes.
- Student demonstrates total self-sufficiency.

Instructions

If you believe you face unusual circumstances that warrant consideration for a determination of independence for financial aid purposes, please submit the following items:

- A detailed letter explaining your unusual circumstances
- Supporting documentation of your unusual circumstances, which includes, but is not limited to:
 - a documented interview between the student and the financial aid administrator;
 - submission of a court order or official federal or state documentation that the student or student's parents or legal guardians are incarcerated;
 - a documented phone call or written statement, which confirms the unusual circumstances with:
 - a state, county or tribal welfare agency;

- an independent living case worker who supports current and former foster youth with the transition to adulthood;
- or a public or private agency, facility, or program servicing the victims of abuse, neglect, assault, or violence.
- a documented phone call or written statement from an attorney, guardian ad litem, a court-appointed special advocate (or similar), or a representative of a TRIO or GEAR UP program which confirms the circumstances and the person's relationship to the student;
- a documented determination of independence made by a financial aid administrator at another institution in the same or a prior award year; or
- utility bills, health insurance, or other documents that demonstrate a separation from parents or legal guardians
- Sign and date the bottom of this form and attach it to your letter and supporting documentation.
