

Getting Started with Sakai for Students

What is Sakai?

Sakai is PLU's learning management system. Professors may use Sakai to distribute class materials, create assignments, and even deliver online tests. Many [tools](#) are available, and your professor chooses tools that are relevant to your class.

How do I log in to Sakai?

You can log in to Sakai using any current web browser.

1. Create Your ePass Account

Sakai uses your ePass username and password. If you haven't already done so, create your ePass account at:

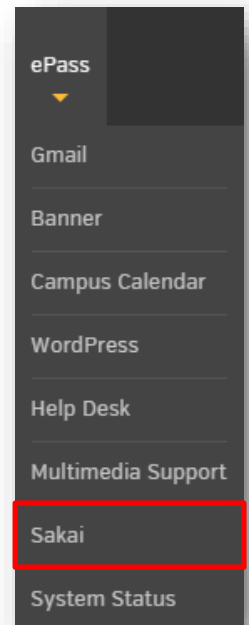

2. Visit the PLU Home Page

You can access Sakai straight from the [PLU home page](#), by clicking on the ePass drop-down menu (top-right corner). From that menu, simply choose the Sakai link to get started. (You can also go to sakai.plu.edu directly and bookmark Sakai in your browser.)

3. Log In to Sakai

On the login page, click on the "PLU ePass" button (top-right corner). Enter your ePass "Username" and "Password" and then click the Sign In button.

Navigating Sakai

Once you login, familiarize yourself with the following areas in Sakai. Your professors choose which tools to use, but below are some of the most popular ones:

- **Resources:** Selected readings, lecture notes, presentations, etc.
- **Announcements:** Important course related news.
- **Assignments:** Complete details on course assignments.
- **Gradebook:** Allows access to all graded course material, assignments, and tests.

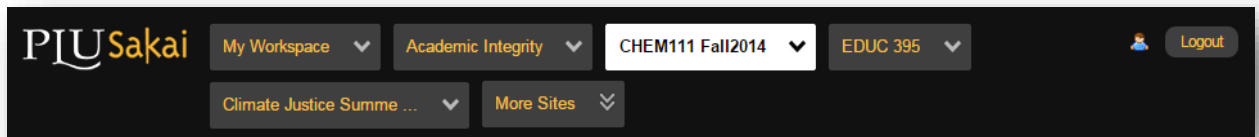

Accessing Course Sites

Tabs across the top of your page allow you to navigate through your Sakai sites. Your current site is highlighted as a white tab.



- **My Workspace:** Access your own personal site in Sakai to adjust your Profile and Preferences. It also provides a private Resources area to upload and store files.
- **Class and Project Sites:** Sakai sites are created at the request of professors, so not all of your classes will have corresponding Sakai sites.
- **More Sites:** Here you will see a listing of all your Sakai sites.

- **Within a Site:** Click the “Help” tool at the bottom left for general help or the blue “?” icon (top-right) for help specific to the area you are in.
