
### **Hist 301: Historical Methods**

#### **Alcohol in World History**

This research seminar explores the cultural history of alcohol in world history. Alcohol has influenced people's perceptions of themselves and others, both within civilizations as well as through the connections among civilizations that result from trade, invasion, colonization, industrialization, and globalization. Alcohol has also shaped gender, ethnic, religious, class, national, and global identities. It has been used as a tool of imperialism as well as resistance to oppression. ## **Hist 499: Seminar (History Capstone)**

#### **Travel and Technology in World History**

This capstone explores the dynamic of *travel* in world history, an ever-present characteristic of the human experience. From ancient times to the present, merchants, missionaries, diplomats, pilgrims, and others have wandered the world seeking new opportunities. Sometimes this has broadened human understanding; at other times the result has been violence, subjugation, or political realignment. At the root of it all is travel—deliberate human movement on foot, horseback, or ship; by car, train, or airplane—even rockets into space or virtual travel via video games or the Internet. This seminar asks students to consider the intersections among travel and technology in global history, in order to understand the powerful contending forces in our world and relate them to individual experience.
