ABOUT THE JUDGES



In demand as a concert soloist, **KELLEY NASSIEF** has recently sung Mozart's *Requiem* with the Louisiana Philharmonic Orchestra, and Mahler's *Symphony No. 2* (Resurrection) with the Tucson Symphony Orchestra. She was soloist in Beethoven's *Symphony No. 9* with the Orquesta Filarmónica de Boca del Rio, Strauss' *Vier letzte Lieder* with the Louisville Orchestra, and in Bernstein's *Symphony No. 3* ("Kaddish") with

Fondazione Orchestra Sinfonica Siciliana in Italy as well as Bardavon 1869 Opera House in New York. Other recent engagements include soloist in Mahler's Symphony No. 2 with the Grand Rapids Symphony and in her Dallas Symphony Orchestra debut; soprano soloist in Bernstein's "Kaddish" Symphony at Konzerthaus Berlin: with Richmond Symphony in Verdi's Requiem, also with the Portland Symphonic Choir; with the Rochester Symphony Orchestra in Beethoven's Symphony No. 9; and with Nashville Symphony in Vaughan Williams' A Sea Symphony. She also sings in recitals regularly in North America and Europe, and has appeared on Japanese television. Ms. Nassief was named a winner of the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions, was awarded a Sullivan Foundation Grant, is a Laureate of the Leonard Bernstein Jerusalem International Oratorio and Song Competition, and received a Richard Tucker Career Grant. Her opera credits include First Lady in Die Zauberflöte (Lyric Opera of Chicago, Philadelphia Opera). Cover of Desdemona in Otello (Lyric Opera of Chicago). Contessa in Le Nozze di Figaro (Portland Opera, Chautauqua Opera, Arizona Opera), Donna Anna in Don Giovanni (Atlanta Opera), Mimi in *La Boheme* (Atlanta Opera, Arizona Opera, Glimmerglass Opera), Liu in *Turandot* (Atlanta Opera), Micaela in *Carmen* (Minnesota Opera, Saarbrucken Germany), Tatiana in Eugene Onegin (Strasbourg Opera), and Donna Elvira in *Don Giovanni* (Eugene Opera). Ms. Nassief is the Director of Opera and Opera Studios and the Marilyn Crilley Professor of Opera at Portland State University. She is a vocal pedagogue sought after for master classes and clinics throughout the country. She has been an adjudicator for several competitions, including National NATS, NW Regional NATS. Ms. Nassief has a private studio in Portland, Oregon.



Soprano **ALLISON POHL**'s vivacious stage presence and spirited singing have inspired enthusiastic responses across three continents. Her work has received positive reviews for her "sparkling voice" (outerstage.com) and "exuberant" performances (Opera News). Of her performance in *L'elisir d'amore* at Virginia Opera, *The Washington Post* wrote: "Allison Pohl stood out with a ripe, flavorful soprano and ample

character." Her 2023/2024 engagements include Violetta in La Traviata at Opera Bend, Social Worker/Reporter in X: The Life and Times of Malcolm X at Seattle Opera, Stella in A Streetcar Named Desire at Tacoma Opera. Tatvana in highlights from Eugene Onegin with SkyOpera, Susanna in Le Nozze di Figaro at Vashon Opera, a solo recital in Freeport, New York, Handel's Messiah with Symphony Tacoma, and several concerts curated by Maestro Keith Lockhart of the Boston Pops. Allison has appeared with opera companies and orchestras throughout the United States, including Boston Lyric Opera, New York City Opera, Virginia Opera, Opera Saratoga, Tacoma Opera, Vashon Opera, Opera in the Heights, Opera Providence, Opera on the James, Seattle Symphony, Canton Symphony, Symphony Tacoma, Bremerton Symphony, Seattle Philharmonic, Garden State Philharmonic, Harmonia Seattle, and SkyOpera. She has been a soloist for orchestral tours in both Italy and China. As a member of Soprello, Allison has performed chamber music across North America with cellist Alistair MacRae. She is the Artistic Director of Vashon Opera, a Seattle Opera Career Grant recipient, winner of the Seattle Philharmonic Concerto Competition, is on faculty at Brevard Music Center, and holds degrees from SUNY Purchase Conservatory of Music and Boston University.



DAVID McDADE first worked with Seattle Opera in 1995 in *Rigoletto* and the *Ring*, joining the staff full-time in 2002. As Head of Coach-Accompanists and Assistant Chorus Master he plays for rehearsals and auditions and is sometimes heard on celesta or piano in the pit with the orchestra. He has accompanied various recitals for Seattle Opera and often accompanies the local rounds of the

Metropolitan Opera Auditions. McDade has been a vocalist, a French horn player, and a conductor.

American soprano **Angela Meade '01** is the winner of both the Metropolitan Opera's 2012 Beverly Sills Artist Award and the 2011 Richard Tucker Award. In 2008, she joined an elite group of singers when, as Elvira in Verdi's *Ernani*, she made her professional operatic debut on the Met stage. Since then, she has fast become recognized as one of today's outstanding vocalists, excelling in the most demanding heroines of the 19th-century bel canto repertoire as well as in the operas of Verdi and Mozart.

A native of Washington State and an alumna of Pacific Lutheran University and the Academy of Vocal Arts, Ms. Meade has triumphed in an astounding number of vocal competitions: 57 in all, including many of the opera world's most important prizes. In addition to being a winner at the 2007 Met National Council Auditions, as documented in *The Audition*, a film that was subsequently released on DVD by Decca, she was also the first singer to take first prize in both the opera and operetta categories of the prestigious Belvedere Competition.
