About Wayne Shorter

Wayne Shorter was an American jazz saxophonist, composer, and bandleader. Born in Newark, New Jersey in 1933, Shorter came to mainstream prominence upon joining Art Blakey's Jazz Messengers in 1959, eventually becoming the band's main composer. In 1964, he joined Miles Davis' Second Great Quintet. Speaking about Shorter's tenure with the Miles Davis' group, pianist Herbie Hancock says, "the master writer to me, in that group, was Wayne Shorter. He still is a master. Wayne was one of the few people who brought music to Miles that didn't get changed." In 1970, he co-founded the jazz fusion band Weather Report. Shorter won twelve Grammy Awards; in 2014, the Recording Academy announced that Shorter was awarded the Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award in honor of his "prolific contributions to our culture and history." As a bandleader, Shorter recorded more than twenty albums, and many of his compositions have become jazz standards.

About the Director

Cassio Vianna is Assistant Professor of Music and Director of Jazz Studies at PLU, where he directs the University Jazz Ensemble and teaches jazz classes and lessons. A native of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, Dr. Vianna is a pianist, music educator, scholar, and an award-winning composer. His compositions and arrangements for jazz ensemble have received international recognition, including awards from the National Band Association, Jazz Education Network, Ithaca College Jazz Composition Competition, and the International Society of Jazz Arrangers and Composers (ISJAC). His works for jazz big band have been performed by artists such as Chris Potter, Ernie Watts, Martha Reeves, the United States Army Field Band (Jazz Ambassadors), and the Colorado Jazz Repertory Orchestra, among others. Dr. Vianna has been featured as a lecturer, adjudicator, and performer at festivals and conferences in the U.S., Latin America, and China. Dr. Vianna holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Rio de Janeiro, a Master of Music degree from Western Oregon University, and a Doctor of Arts degree in jazz studies from the University of Northern Colorado.
