Autumn Variations tells the story of the changes in weather as the world dives deeper into the Fall. Each variation on the melody depicts a different element of the season. It begins by painting the picture of trees with their leaves turning red as the warmth of summer fades, before the trees are shaken and leaves are scattered to the ground by the rain and the wind. After the storms are over, only a few leaves remain on their trees until the frosty air of December finally plucks them from their branches.

Moonflower is a nocturnal waltz inspired by the Irish composer John Field. A nocturne is a piano piece that is inspired by the night, and a moonflower is a plant that only blooms in the moonlight. Both the nocturne and the moonflower symbolize beauty, dreaminess, and mystery. The melodic lines of a nocturne were meant to represent the female voice, and moonflowers are also a symbol of femininity, which is important to me to represent as a female composer.
