DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Happiness is different from Joy. Sadness is different from Melancholy... can you spot the difference in this curious little farce?

As I've sat with Melancholy Play this past year, I've strained to listen between the lines of absurd scenarios and silly accents, puzzling over what Sarah Ruhl could possibly mean in examining the role of Melancholy in our daily lives. While some characters bemoan 'happiness' in favor of romanticizing Melancholy, the argument seems more apparent in everything these characters say when not directly commenting on Melancholy vs. Happiness. Tilly is fascinated by words and strangers (intently paying attention to details in her world), Frank and Frances are comforted by feeling reciprocally accountable to others, but Joan and Lorenzo tend to lack this curiosity or reciprocity at the beginning of the play. The characters of Melancholy Play arc towards finding joy in the sadness and beauty of our ephemeral world.

In his book Inciting Joy, author and poet Ross Gay asks, "But what happens if joy is not separate from pain? What if joy and pain are fundamentally tangled up with one another? Or even more to the point, what if joy is not only entangled with pain, or suffering, or sorrow, but is also what emerges from how we care for each other through those things?" Joy and community/ relationships interweaves through the comedy and absurdist elements of this play. Tilly finds great joy- even pride- in romanticizing her sadness into Melancholy. Her unabashed sorrows inspire and delight other characters to also wonder at the world and embrace their repressed Melancholia. But when one feels alone in their sorrows, the risk is...turning into an almond? We find joy when we feel held, nonjudgmentally, through our Melancholy, even when we are apart from our loved ones.

May this show bring you laughter, joy and a line or two of poetic dialogue that sticks to your soul, a recognition of whatever variety of Melancholy you've experienced!
