About the Clinicians

Brian Galante is Associate Dean of the School of Music, Theatre & Dance, and Director of Choral Studies at PLU. In Fall 2022, he became the seventh conductor of the Choir of the West. During his tenure at PLU, Dr. Galante has also conducted Chorale, University Singers, and Knights Chorus, and taught undergraduate courses in Vocal Pedagogy for the Choral Music Educator, Choral Methods, and Choral Literature. Dr. Galante received the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in choral conducting, with a related field in voice science and pedagogy, from the University of North Texas. He holds Master of Music and Bachelor of Music degrees from Louisiana State University. Choirs under Galante's direction have offered invitational performances in Carnegie Hall and Avery Fisher Hall, Lincoln Center, New York; the Meyerson Symphony Center, Dallas; Notre Dame Cathedral and Sacre Coeur, Paris; the 2010 Washington Music Educators Association conference; the 2011 Northwest MENC Conference; and the 2012 Northwest Division ACDA Conference. Frequently in demand as a clinician and adjudicator, Dr. Galante has conducted honor choirs at all levels. He remains an active member of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA), National Collegiate Choral Organization (NCCO), the American Society for Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP), Washington ACDA, and the Washington Music Educators Association. He served as President of the Northwestern ACDA Region from 2018-2020, Conference Chair of the 2020 Northwestern ACDA Region Conference, Program Chair of the 2010 and 2018 Conferences, on the National ACDA Technology Committee (2007-2011), Associate Conference Chair of the 2013 National ACDA Conference, and President of Louisiana ACDA from 2001-2003.

Tiffany Walker is a Filipino-American choral conductor from Chino Hills, California currently based in the Seattle/Tacoma area. Dr. Walker is Visiting Assistant Professor of Choral Music at PLU, where she conducts the University Chorale and the University Singers. She obtained the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in choral conducting at the University of Washington. While studying at UW, she served as an assistant conductor for the Chamber Singers, Chorale, and Treble Choir. She was also the Music Director for Messiah Lutheran Church in Seattle. In July 2019, she was a conducting fellow at the San Diego Choral Conducting Workshop, led by Patrick Walders. Prior to her studies at UW, Dr. Walker taught as a high school choral director at San Clemente High School and Ruben S. Ayala High School. Her auditioned groups won gold ratings at Heritage Festivals in various cities nationwide. She conducted the Ayala Women's Ensemble during a concert tour to Puerto Rico. She also helped prepare rehearsals and sang with the Ayala Vocal Ensemble at the Third International Choral Festival in Lima, Peru. Dr. Walker was a member of the Pacific Chorale and sang as an alto under the direction of John Alexander. Some of her accomplishments with Pacific Chorale include performances at the Hollywood Bowl and participation in many live concerts and CD recordings in Orange County. She completed a Master of Arts in teaching degree and single-subject credential in K-12 music at the University of Southern California. Her Bachelor of Arts degree is in music from the University of California, Berkeley.

Barry Johnson is enjoying a successful career as an opera singer, stage director, concert performer, and voice teacher. Having sung roles in more than twenty productions at Seattle Opera, Professor Johnson has performed as a guest artist with companies throughout the west including Seattle Opera, Tacoma Opera, Opera Colorado, Anchorage Opera, Portland Opera, Vashon Opera, Stockton Opera, Central City Opera, and Las Vegas Opera. Notable roles in his repertoire include the title role in *The Marriage of Figaro*, Mercutio in *Romeo and Juliet*, Marcello in *La Bohème*, Dancairo in *Carmen*, Sharpless in Madame Butterfly, Masetto in Don Giovanni, Prince Ottokar in Der Freischütz, Angelotti in Tosca, Papageno in The Magic Flute, Don Alfonso in Così Fan Tutte, Fleville in Andrea Chenier, Frank in Die Fledermaus, Jupiter in Orpheus in the Underworld, and the Pirate King in The Pirates of Penzance. On the concert stage, Professor Johnson has been a soloist with orchestras throughout the Northwest including Seattle Symphony, American Sinfonietta, Symphony Tacoma, Yakima Symphony, Northwest Sinfonietta, Orchestra Seattle, and the Pacific Lutheran University Symphony. Concert engagements have included Orff's Carmina Burana, Handel's Messiah, Brahms' Ein Deutsches Requiem, Rachmaninoff's The Bells, Haydn's Creation, Vaughan Williams' Five Tudor Portraits, Frahm's War Cantata, Bach's Magnificat, Mozart's Requiem, and Faure's Requiem. Professor Johnson's professional stage directing credits include Puccini's La Bohème, Mozart's Così fan tutte, Humperdinck's Hansel and Gretel, Lehar's The Merry Widow, Puccini's Tosca, Menotti's The Telephone, and Pasatieri's La Divina, with Tacoma Opera, Bellevue City Opera Ballet, and Pacific Northwest Opera. As Co-Director of Opera at Pacific Lutheran University, Professor Johnson's fully staged productions have included Lehar's The Merry Widow, Mozart's The Magic Flute, Sondheim's Into the Woods, Humperdinck's Hansel and Gretel, Strauss' Die Fledermaus, Sullivan's The Pirates of Penzance, and Puccini's Gianni Schicchi and Suor Angelica.
