About the Performers

Jennifer Rhyne is Associate Professor of Flute and Music Theory at Pacific Lutheran University. She holds degrees from Oberlin College and Conservatory of Music, the University of Michigan, and Stony Brook University. She plays Second Flute with Symphony Tacoma, Principal Flute with Vashon Opera, and appears regularly with groups including NW Sinfonietta, Olympia Symphony, Lyric Opera NW, and on programs such as the Icicle Creek Concert Series, the Walla Walla Chamber Music Festival, and the Second City Chamber Music Series. Dr. Rhyne has been a lecturer and clinician across the US and abroad. Her article "Discovering Muczynski's Unknown Gem" was published in 2019 in *The Flutist Quarterly*. She served as the Assistant Program Chair for the 2017 National Flute Association's Convention.

Elizabeth Landis is a much sought-after harpist in the greater Seattle and Tacoma area. As a concert harpist she serves as principal harpist of Symphony Tacoma and Northwest Sinfonietta, among others. She's performed professionally with the Seattle Symphony Orchestra, Seattle Opera, Columbus Symphony Orchestra, Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, Jacksonville Symphony, Harrisburg Symphony Orchestra, Tallahassee Symphony, Oakland Symphony, Santa Rosa Symphony, Modesto Symphony, and more. She is an educator at Pacific Lutheran University and the Seattle Youth Symphony Orchestra's Marrowstone Music Festival. She has performed with the prestigious Aspen Summer Music Festival's various orchestras, and was showcased in concert with The Lancaster Festival as a Wilkes Fellow. In her spare time, she enjoys hiking, painting, and training her cats to use "talking" buttons.

Artistic Director, Melanie Kirk-Stauffer, is the principal trainer and choreographer for Dance Theatre Northwest. She has a lifetime of experience in dance. An internationally recognized choreographer, Melanie has a history of having produced and directed numerous successful shows for family audiences including Swan Lake, Nutcracker, Les Sylphides, America, Let Freedom Ring, The Jewel Heart, The Snow Queen, The Twelve Dancing Princesses, The Red Shoes, Back to Broadway, and Beautiful Ballets. She has also choreographed and produced for television and video. Excerpts from several of her original productions have won regional and national awards. Under Melanie's direction, Dance Theatre Northwest received the Margaret K. Williams Arts Award from The Pierce County Arts Commission, a Cultural Diversity Award from Access Broadway of New York, and two Awards of Excellence from the city of University Place. Melanie has been recognized in the 2003 Celebration of Women photo essay exhibit by Ruthann Reim and in the Mt. Tahoma High School Alumni Hall of Fame. Formerly a professional dancer with The Huntington Dance Ensemble (Ballet Repertory) in New York under the artistic direction of Richard Englund, Melanie's professional performing dance experience includes leading roles in the ballet classics Paquita, Pas De Quatre, La Bayadere (Kingdom of The Shades), Divertimento, Pas de Dix (Act III Raymonda), Grande Tarantelle, Crazy Quilt, Courtley Dances; contemporary, jazz, and musical theatre roles in H.M.S. Pinafore, Oophytes, Resentiments, Akimbo, Tango, and Serenade. Melanie has served as a dance fitness expert, choreographer for Orchesis Dance Groups at Western Washington University and Evergreen State College, and as a judge for local and regional dance festivals and competitions. She has studied many forms of dance including training at England's Royal Academy of Dance, the San Francisco, and Joffrey Ballets. Her dance career includes training and performance in ballet, jazz, tap, theatre, modern, character, contemporary, folk, and ballroom dance. She has numerous teaching certifications in dance, dance exercise, and dance science, as well as training in Horton, Luigi, Cunningham, and Graham dance techniques. Melanie holds degrees in dance from Skidmore College and Business Management from Columbia Pacific University. She currently teaches at Pierce College and previously served as an adjunct faculty member at Western Washington University and Tacoma Community College.
