Sarah Seder (Executive Director, Choreographer) is the Resident Assistant Professor of Dance at PLU. Previously, she taught dance at Smith College (MA), Mount Holyoke College (MA). She co-founded and co-directed Seattle-based Sapience Dance Collective from 2008-2016. Her work has been seen at On The Boards and Meany Hall and she has performed in the work of Pat Graney, Marlo Martin, and Wade Madsen among others. She is also a reviewer of jazz dance submissions for Young Arts. Seder earned her BA in Dance and Psychology from Bard College and her MFA in Dance from Smith College.

Amelia Bolyard (Guest Choreographer) Amelia Bolyard is a Seattle based improvisational performance artist, choreographer and composer across art genres. She received RAD (Royal Academy of Dance) formal dance training Cornish College of the Arts from 1986-1995 in the preparatory program. Amelia has choreographed and performed with numerous Seattle based modern and ballet companies, musicians and theater companies over the last 30 years. Her most recent works are centered around self-care and serving her community, in particular, the youth. She is the creator of J.O.D.E: Joy of Dance Experience, a holistic, selfcare centered movement practice intended to support the physical, emotional and mental well being of performing artists. Most currently, Amelia creates improvisational music and teaches JODE in her new home on Vashon Island.

Wade Madsen (Guest Choreographer) has been a dance creator and teacher in Seattle for 45 years. He is professor emeritus at Cornish College of the Arts. He has created over two hundred works that have been seen and performed nationally and internationally. He continues to teach for Exit space and trains in the gyrotonic method.

Cora Beeson (Choreographer) is a PLUS-year global studies major with minors in gender, sexuality, and race studies and political science. She grew up dancing many styles and for middle and high school attended Vancouver School of Arts and Academics where she furthered her dance training and choreographed her own pieces for the first time. Since then, she has choreographed "Shadow Embrace" for *Dance 2024* (PLU), and taught choreography for dance clubs on campus such as Burlesque and Cypher.

Camilee Boland (Choreographer) is a fourth-year chemistry major with minors in biology and dance and an emphasis is biochemistry on the pre-med track. She grew up dancing competitively, and was a captain for her high school dance team for three years. Since then, she's danced on the PLU dance team with this being her second year as a captain. She has choreographed numerous dances in a variety of styles for both the dance team and Dance 2024.

Parker Brown (Choreographer) is a fourth-year acting/directing major with minors in dance and writing. He started his dance career at PLU, working on styles including contemporary, musical theatre, and tap. His passion for dance involves using unconventional movement qualities in his choreography, working with his dancers to draw out their strengths and personalities, and focusing on story and expression. Using his focus on directing, he aims to tell stories that inspire audiences to reflect upon both themselves and the environment around them in order to strengthen the communities around them.

Samantha Rose Katz (Choreographer) is a PLUS-year musical theatre major with minors in music and dance. She began dance classes at age seven and has over 10 years of experience in jazz, tap, contemporary, musical theatre, ballet, and various other dance styles. Her notable choreographic works include "Look Down Blood Moon" for Dance 2023 (PLU) and several productions with Tacoma Musical Playhouse's educational program. 

She has been dancing since she was four, and although most of her background is in ballet, her time at PLU has been transformative, allowing her to branch out into other styles. She has choreographic experience in ballet, contemporary, and musical theatre dance, and choreographed "Being Unknown" for *Dance 2024* last spring, as well as *The Great American Songbook: a musical revue* (PLU) this past fall.

Soraya Martinez (Choreographer) is a second-year business major with a concentration in marketing and management and dance minor. She has been dancing since she was five in various styles including contemporary, hip-hop, jazz, and ballet. She has worked with Elite Performance as a dance and business intern, worked with groups such as the LSU Tigar Girls Alumni, Seahawks Dancers, and professionals from the PNW area. She has been dancing for a total of 16 years and specializes in styles such as jazz, lyrical, ballet, tap, hip hop, and contemporary. She danced on a competitive team for the last two years of high school where she had the opportunity to choreograph multiple dances, ranging from groups to solos. She choreographed for and performed in *Dance 2024* (PLU).

Monroe Torkelson (Choreographer) is a PLUS-year theatre and communications double major, with minors in dance and Norwegian. While she has danced all her life, her first formal training began in second grade with Hawaiian dance. Then, in high school she gained experience in hip hop, lyrical/contemporary dance, jazz, and Bollywood dance. Monroe has years of experience choreographing for different styles of dance. Some of their choreographic works while at PLU include "Stuck" for *Dance 2021*, "Growing" for *Dance 2022*, and *When You Wish Upon A Star: a musical revue* as well as leading the improvisational dance piece, "Movement Journey" for *Dance 2024*.

Cadelyn Wood (Choreographer) is a second-year political science major with minors in dance and pre-law. She began dancing at age three and has experience in ballet, contemporary, modern, jazz, musical theatre, and tap, though tap remains her favorite. She was West Salem High School Theatre's dance captain for two years, and choreographed several numbers for various performances, including *The Drowsy Chaperone, Mamma Mia*, and *The Comedy of Errors*. This is her first piece with PLU Theatre and Dance and she is so excited to tap again!
