Sarah Seder (Executive Director and Choreographer) is the Resident Assistant Professor of Dance at PLU. She has choreographed hundreds of dances and has performed in her own work and in the work of many renowned choreographers throughout the PNW as well as nationally and internationally. In addition to her work at PLU she teaches children's dance classes for her own three kids and other young movers and is a national reviewer of dance submissions for Young Arts. For nearly a decade she co-directed Seattle-based Sapience Dance Collective. Before PLU she taught dance at Smith College (MA), Mount Holyoke College (MA) and at numerous studios in the greater seattle area. Seder earned her BA in Dance and Psychology from Bard College and her MFA in Dance from Smith College.

Lucille Jun (Guest Artist) a native Washingtonian, is a dancer, choreographer, teacher, martial artist, and Mom with a capital M. For nearly a decade, she danced professionally with award-winning Yeon Arts Company in South Korea. Interested in the power of storytelling through movement, she is currently diving into new movement possibilities and aesthetics based on her contemporary, traditional Korean, and hip hop backgrounds. Her work has recently been shown at Wapato Park, Exit Space, Pacific Lutheran University, Velocity Dance Center, Amherst College (MA), Smith College (MA), AS22 (RI), The Root Cellar (MA), Hudson Guild Theater (NY), SCD&T, and the Seoul Olympic Park Arena amongst others. She received an MFA in Dance from Smith College.

Jovon Lamar Miller (Guest Artist) At Pacific Lutheran University (PLU), Jovon Miller serves as the Tap Instructor/Lecturer, championing inclusive, student-centered learning and welcoming dancers of every age and level. A performing artist, choreographer, educator, and mentor, he holds a B.A. in Dance from Western Washington University, with specialized training in tap and certification from Acrobatic Arts. His choreography has been featured at the Seattle International Dance Festival, Full Tilt, and Western Washington University's Education Matinee. Recent performance highlights include The 5th Avenue Theatre's After Midnight (musician—reeds) in August, followed by teaching and performing at Camp Hollywood, one of the world's largest Lindy Hop events. Additional stage credits include Benaroya Hall, Carnegie Hall, and international engagements in Canada and Italy. Honors include finalist recognition from the Society of Voice Arts and Sciences (Outstanding Storytelling) and the 2009 Congressional Black Caucus Spouses Performing Arts Scholarship for tap.
