

WHY PLU STRINGS?

- PLU offers the most comprehensive music faculty of any private university in the Pacific Northwest.
- Students have access to music scholarships regardless of major and may participate in solo recitals, orchestral music, chamber music, early music, opera ensembles, and musical theater ensembles.
- Students who choose to major in music education in strings have a nearly 100% job placement rate upon graduation. Other music students have gone on to graduate placement in music performance (at schools such as Cincinnati College Conservatory of Music, Yale University), music therapy (Radford University), and musicology (Brown University).
