Paul-Elliott Cobbs is an avid educator and world-renowned maestro. His talent and amicable personality have inspired both musicians and symphony-goers throughout the world. As Music Director, Dr. Cobbs conducts the Tacoma Youth Symphony, Tacoma Junior Youth Symphony, annual Chamber Orchestra (formerly the Bach Festival) and Peter and the Wolf Children's Concert. In addition to his conducting duties, Dr. Cobbs is the head of the chamber music program and leads the musical direction of the entire organization. He is also the Music Director of the Evergreen Music Festival. In addition to his work with the Tacoma Youth Symphony Association, Dr. Cobbs is Music Director and Conductor of the Everett Philharmonic and frequent Guest Conductor and adjudicator throughout the world. Having just returned from England where he conducted the Sussex Symphony, he has also recently completed 26 years with the Everett Symphony and seven years as Director of Orchestras at Central Washington University and is currently the Music Director and Conductor and Conductor of the Everett Philharmonic.
