Program Notes

Mannin Veen (1933) is standard repertoire for wind bands, however, it is not as commonly performed today as it once was. Wood lived most of his life on the Isle of Man, a British island in the Irish Sea between England and Ireland. The Gaelic title translated as "Dear Isle of Man" is clearly a tribute to his beautiful childhood home. The composition explores four distinct folk melodies in the following order, The Good Old Way (primarily a Dorian mode hymn song), The Manx Fiddler (a fast tempo reel), Sweet Water in the Common (a traditional Manx ballad), and finally The Harvest of the Sea (a sea song of Thanksgiving).

Katahj Copley is a bright new voice in the wind band world and beyond. *Halcyon Hearts* (2020) is inspired loosely by the biblical text of 1 Corinthians 13, "Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth, it will always protect, trust, hope, and persevere, and for you love never fails." The composition is ultimately about what inspires our deepest loves and passions in life and how all people are connected. The composer reminds us to "choose love" no matter the negatively that might surround us in today's world.

Noisy Wheels of Joy (2001) is a lesser performed composition by the prolific Eric Whitacre, which is unfortunate as it is so fun to learn and perform. From the score, the composer writes: "Noisy Wheels of Joy is just pure, simple fun, written in the tradition of the great comic operatic overtures, and was designed to start (or end) the program with a bang. The structure is quite formal, but the three themes (love, adventure, and *buffa*) get thrown around the wind symphony with wild abandon."

Roger Zare's *Meditation on Amen* (2018) is a tribute to the retirement of Michael Gibson, director of bands at Ridgeview Charter Middle School in Sandy Springs, Georgia. The composition is based on a favorite gospel hymn of the retiring director, Curtis Mayfield's *Amen*.

About the Student Conductor

Jason Parshall is a senior music education student with an emphasis in secondary band. He is a member of the University Wind Ensemble, Jazz Ensemble, and the saxophone chamber ensembles. He has also participated for the past two school years in the Concert Band percussion section. Jason will be completing his student teaching at Decatur High School in Federal Way next Fall semester.

About the Director

Ron Gerhardstein is Associate Professor of Music Education and Associate Director of Bands at PLU. In addition to directing the University Concert Band, he teaches coursework related to music education, instrumental methods, and the supervision of student teachers. Prior to his appointment in 2014, he taught for thirteen years in the West Valley School District in Yakima, Washington. Recent guest conducting appearances include the WMEA Jr. All-State "Rainier" Band (2017), the South West Washington Small Schools Honor Band (2018), the Lake Washington School District Honor Band (2018), and the Asia-Pacific (APAC) Honor Band in Kobe, Japan (2019).

Dr. Gerhardstein holds degrees from the University of Idaho and Temple University. Dr. Gerhardstein is currently serving as the President of the Washington Music Education Association (WMEA). He lives in Tacoma with his wife Jerilyn, a teacher-librarian in the Bethel School District.
