General education course requirements are listed assuming that major classes will not count toward the general education course requirements. If a course counts towards a major and a general education requirement (e.g. PSYC 101 if the student is a psychology major), students will still need to take enough courses (shown here as electives) to reach the 128 credits needed to graduate.

• **NOTE:** See your advisor and the Wang Center for semester and year- long study-away programs in France. Be sure to consult with your advisor about study away course offerings and to obtain pre-approval for some courses (usually two), so that you are sure the credits for those courses will count towards the Hispanic Studies major

Departmental Requirements

- To remain in the Hispanic Studies major, students must maintain a 2.50 overall grade point average (GPA) and maintain a 2.50 GPA in all Hispanic and Latino Studies courses required for the major or the minor.
- A minimum of 36 semester hours beyond HISP 102
- Majors are strongly encouraged to pursue at least one semester of study in a Spanish-speaking country on a program approved by the Hispanic Studies faculty. Majors may not normally fulfill the requirements for the major through the election of 300-level courses during the senior year.

General Degree Requirements

- A minimum of 128 semester hours must be completed with a GPA of 2.50 or higher.
- In addition to the requirements of this major, students must complete all other requirements of
- the University as listed in the catalog.
- At least 8 semester hours for the major must be taken in residence at PLU.
- All students must complete a minimum of 40 semester hours of Upper-Division work (300-400 level) which includes courses in the major.
- Students should earn 32 semester hours per year to stay on track to graduate in 4-years (which requires a minimum of 128 semester hours).
