Note that BIOL 205 is typically only offered Fall term; BIOL 206, BIOL 201, and CHEM 105 are typically only offered Spring term. Well-prepared students in high school science and math may take BIOL 205 & BIOL 206 during their first year at PLU, otherwise this course series should be taken in the sophomore year.

STAT 231, PSYC 320, & NURS 120 may be taken anytime before entry into the nursing program, even in the first year, depending on student's level of preparedness and course availability.

Incoming transfer students accepted into the School of Nursing are highly encouraged to obtain an Associate's Degree / Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) BEFORE entering PLU. See your CAPP report and talk to your advisor/ Admission Counselor for details on non-nursing classes required to graduate.
