

Course Sequencing

Most students complete the prerequisites for the social work program their first two years. They then take major courses during their junior and senior years. A typical sequence of courses is as follows:

For transfer students wishing to complete the program in two years (assuming that most liberal arts prerequisites have been met), this is a typical course plan:

*You may take the sociology or social work elective in any semester where your schedule permits.

¹Research Methods (SOCW or SOCI) and the Sociology section of Statistics may be taken in any order, so long as both are completed before the student enters field placement.
