Course Description:

The course will focus on the world of the pharaohs, but will also include sites and museums that are relevant to Hellenistic, Roman, and Early Christian Egypt. There will be a particular emphasis on integrating the antiquities in Egypt with the collections of the British Museum in London in order to better understand the continuity and change in the history, art, literature, society, religion, and world views of ancient Egypt. While in London, we will have the opportunity to interview Egyptologists.

In the event that the current transitional phase in Egypt prevents this course from traveling there next January, an exciting alternative may be developed that will still focus on Egypt, along with the eastern Mediterranean, and will include first-hand observation of ancient Egyptian antiquities.
