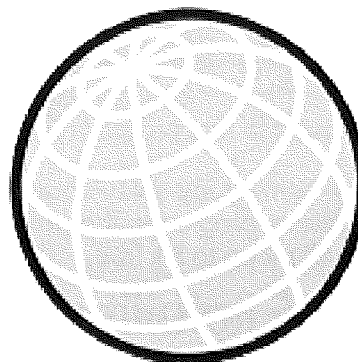

Global Scholar AWARDS

As a globally-focused university, Pacific Lutheran University offers study away programs to students from all backgrounds. The reality of this commitment has been greatly expanded by the addition of a \$2 million endowment which funds the Global Scholar Award Program*. Application

Please print in BLOCK LETTERS in black ink.

PLU study away programs cost the same as the PLU comprehensive fee.

Students may receive up to \$2,500 for a semester-long study away program. This award is to be used to cover costs such as airfare, passport fees, immunizations, and in-country daily expenses.

It is not to be used to pay program fees.

For a January-Term study away course and PLU faculty led summer programs, the program fee may be reduced by up to \$1,000.

Eligibility

Students must complete a FAFSA to be eligible for an award. Those with demonstrated high financial need, as defined by the FAFSA*, are eligible to apply for the Award.
