Course Description:

Set in beautiful Budapest and Hungary, this course will build cross-cultural competence. Special attention will be given to the poor, Roma and Jewish culture. Home and school visits and cultural excursions will provide opportunity for understanding first hand the reality of life for these cultural and ethnic groups. Intensive interactions will be developed as students assist in providing English instruction in an elementary school.
