Course Description:

Students begin student teaching in Katutura, Namibia, a township of Windhoek on this 8-week J-term program. While in the city, there are multiple opportunities to interact with significant individuals in the Namibian community. In addition to spending time in the city we have weekend excursions to a farm in the Kalahari Desert and to Sossusvlei National Park in the Namib Desert. We also have a 6-day excursion to the North and visit the Cheetah Conservation Foundation, Ondao Mobile School, and Etosha National Park. Assignments goals and school activities are intended to deepen students' cultural competence to serve them well as education professionals.
