Course Description:

Travel time in NZ is approximately three weeks, including visits to locations on both the South Island (Christchurch, Akaroa/Banks Peninsula) and the North Island (Wellington, Tauranga, Rotorua, Auckland). One goal of this program is to experience the day-to-day life of New Zealanders and discover how stories reflect the place and activities of the people and cultures. Students will participate in studies of New Zealand authors. Together, we will study the works of Margaret Mahy, the NZ award-winning writer. Then, students will choose their own author to study, culminating in a paper and presentation upon return.

April 12th, 2013. A non-refundable deposit of \$50.00 is required with the application. A \$250 non-refundable payment to confirm participation in the course is due within 10 days of notification of acceptance. Maximum 18 students.
