

Heidi Schutz, Ph.D. (Site Director Fall 2020) is an Associate Professor of Biology at Pacific Lutheran University. She was born in Bogotá, Colombia and emigrated to the United States at age eight. She received her B.A. in Physical Anthropology from the University of California Santa Cruz and she completed both her masters and doctoral degrees at the University of Colorado Boulder. Her Master of Science is in Museum and Field Studies with an emphasis in Paleontology and her Doctorate is in Ecology and Evolutionary Biology. She was also a Chancellor's Postdoctoral Fellow at the University of California Riverside. Her research interests center around the evolution of physiological and skeletal traits in vertebrates. With a specific emphasis in sex-related differences, she uses two and three-dimensional imaging to study skeletal anatomy. She and her students are currently collaborating with colleagues at the University of Calgary on a project exploring how habitat influences the skeletal sex differences in three-spine stickleback fish. She teaches Anatomy and Physiology, Comparative Anatomy and Cadaver Prosection courses at PLU.
