





Figure 5. Abshalom Jac Lahav. Anne Frank (Obama Shirt), 2009. Oil on canvas, 24 × 24 in. Courtesy of the artist

#### The Sapling Story




From her only window to the outside world, Anne Frank could see the sky, birds and a majestic chestnut tree. "As long as this exists", Anne wrote in her diary, "how can I be sad?" During the two years she spent in the Secret Annex, the solace Anne found in her chestnut tree provided a powerful contrast to the Holocaust unfolding beyond her attic window. And as war narrowed in on Anne and her family, her tree became a vivid reminder that a better world was possible.

Anne's tree would outlive its namesake by more than 50 years, before being weakened by disease and succumbing to a windstorm in 2010. But today, thanks to dozens of saplings propagated in the months before its death, Anne's tree lives on in cities and towns around the world. Here in the United States, the Sapling Project is bringing eleven of these precious trees to specially selected locations across the country. As the saplings take root, they will emerge as living monuments to Anne's pursuit of peace and tolerance. In the process, they will serve as powerful

reminders of the horrors borne by hate and bigotry and the need for collective action in the face of injustice.









# QUESTION: WHAT HAPPENED TO ANNE FRANK AFTER SHE LEFT HER HIDING PLACE?

- I. She moved to New York with her father after the war and reworked her diary for publication. It was a smashing success because it dramatized the power of hope in desperate times.
- 2. She remained in Amsterdam, published her diary after the war, and raised money to convert their hiding place into a museum. She gave tours there well into her old age, inspiring visitors with her hopeful outlook and attitude of forgiveness toward the past.
- 3. She was deported to Auschwitz but escaped with her diary. She moved to Switzerland with the only other surviving family member, her father. There she published her diary and made a fortune in royalties.
- 4. Starving and miserable, she died of typhus in Bergen Belsen concentration camp at the age of 15.



# What Anne Frank Taught Us About Survial

At this time of Global confrontation with the Covid-19 Virus, it might be valuable to reflect on the commitment and persistence that Anne Frank and her family endured to escape another type of deadly disease. After all, the tools for fighting evil giants are strikingly similar.

Anne and her family had to banish all forms of social interaction, to keep from being exposed to the evil that sought them. They only associated with a few trusted souls and otherwise managed to keep themselves from the public interaction. So, the Frank family taught us to be focused on limiting social interaction. And for 748 days they were successful. It was successful for them, and will be for us.

Finally, it was the notion that help will come, encouraged by hope. To us, researchers will find a cure, or at least an inoculation, or a prescription will be discovered to chase away the cough and fever and congestion. Or maybe, time will simply ease this plague into nothingness. With Anne, she did get to leave the attic, and then faced the possibility of death in a concentration camp. But as history tells us, it wasn't the feared enemy that killed her, it was another evil, typhus fever, which took Anne Frank's life. Her father Otto went on to live another forty years after the family was discovered and removed from the tiny attic. In doing so, he was able to share Anne's story with the world. The story of survival. The story of great hope. And that hope is what we must keenly pursue.
