PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The IHON-Oxford J-Term Program is a unique chance to experience the world-renowned Oxford tutorial system at the University of Oxford, and explore the stimulating, culturally diverse city of Oxford, England. The program is a four-week version of our Fall and Spring IHON-Oxford Gateways, and is particularly suited to students unable to study away for a whole semester. In the first week of the course we learn to 'read' aspects of British culture, politics, and history, in preparation for various site visits around the UK later in the program. We will also begin a writing intensive module designed to provide preparation for your Oxford tutorial. For your tutorial, you choose amongst topics offered by Oxford scholars, from 'Medicine and Emergency Humanitarianism' to 'The Future of Cities' to 'Intersections of Race, Gender and Sexuality,' 'Music and the Novel' and topics in literature, culture, history and politics. Throughout the program you will be supported in strengthening writing skills, including through one-on-one work with Oxford-based site coordinator for our semester programs, Dr. Evan Easton-Calabria (a scholar of Refugee and Forced Migration Studies in Oxford). All program participants live together in houses in Oxford, and site visits will include the capital, London.
