PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This course will apply a scientific and historic perspective to explore the classic ideas of “good” and “evil.” We will read and discuss literature from the scientific field of Moral Psychology—which integrates ideas from evolutionary anthropology, philosophy, developmental and cognitive psychology—and we will explore the rich history of Bavaria, including the rise of Nazism and crimes perpetuated in the Holocaust. We will use interdisciplinary behavioral research to gain a better understanding of concepts such as altruism, authoritarianism, bigotry, genocide, and power, and relate these concepts to fundamental human needs such as belonging, cognition, status, and understanding.
