PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The IHON-Oxford J-Term Program is designed to offer both IHON and non-IHON PLU students a short version of the educational experience for which Oxford and Cambridge are best known: the one-on-one tutorial between student and teacher. The program is a four-week version of our Fall and Spring IHON-Oxford Gateways, and is particularly suited to students who are not able to study away for a whole semester. In the first week of the course we explore basic features of British history and culture, as well as aspects of the new. super-diverse Britain, visible particularly in the transnational hub of' London. We will also begin a writing intensive module designed to provide preparation for your one-on-one tutorial. For your tutorial, you choose amongst topics offered by Oxford scholars, from 'Medicine and Emergency Humanitarianism' to 'The Future of Cities' to 'Black Queer Studies,' 'Music and the Novel' and other interdisciplinary topics. Throughout the program you will be supported in strengthening your writing skills, including through one-on-one work with Oxford-based site coordinator for our semester programs, Dr. Evan Easton-Calabria (a scholar of Refugee and Forced Migration Studies in Oxford). All program participants live, study, and cook together in houses in the vibrant, diverse city of Oxford.
