### COURSE OVERVIEW

Through community engagement, readings, critical reflections, and group debriefing, we will explore the meaning of service and community cultural wealth in Tobago. We discuss power and intersectionality focusing largely on race, gender, and nationality and how positionality (shaped by white supremacy) impacts the ways we are able to live, learn, and interact with Tobagonians and others in the course. Students will learn about health, educational, and social service strengths and challenges in Tobago from professionals in each of those fields. We will participate in a variety of excursions designed to introduce students to the physical as well as cultural and social environment of Tobago.
