Brief Introduction to Title IX

- **Title IX (est. 1972)**

Began as a way to equalize women in sports in higher education

“No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.”

- **Dear Colleague Letter (April 2011)**

Released by the Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights. Expanded Title IX to outline a University's responsibility and obligation to prevent, address, and act in cases of sexual violence.

Today's Title IX - "The Final Rule"

- New Regulations regarding higher ed's Title IX responsibilities released May 6, 2020

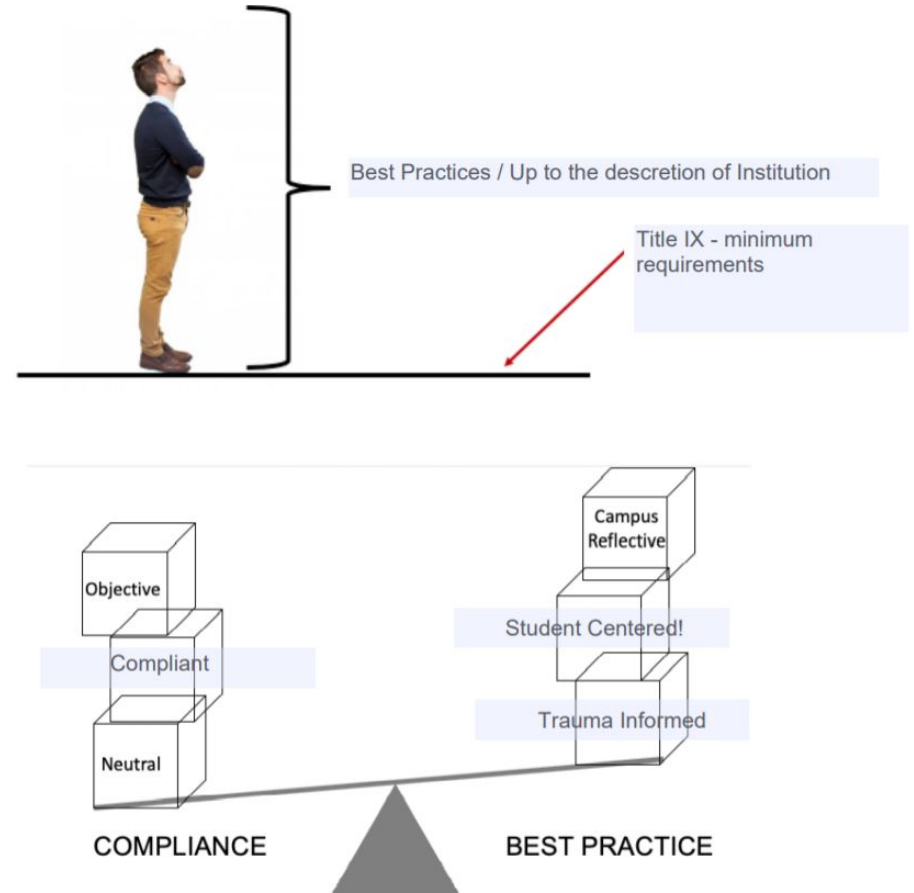
These federal mandates have created a framework that we need to work within when it comes to our Sexual Misconduct and Title IX process and our policies regarding such.

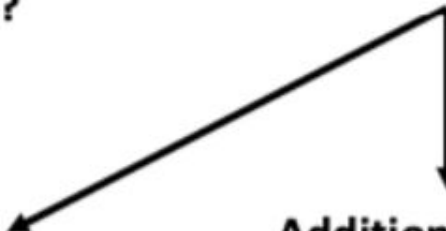

Who Are “Mandatory Reporters”?

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Institutions may choose who will act as mandatory reporters on their campuses.

PLU will continue to have all employees AND all RAs/ CAs and Campus Safety student employees designated as mandatory reporters.

***Notice given to the Title IX Coordinator or an official with authority to institute corrective measures on the recipient’s behalf, will then “charge” the school with actual knowledge and trigger the school’s obligation to respond.
