SEXUAL MISCONDUCT

Sexual misconduct is a broad term. It encompasses any unwelcome behavior of a sexual nature that is committed without consent and/or by force, intimidation, coercion or manipulation.

- Sexual Harassment
 - Exploitation
 - Intimidation
- Sexual Assault
- Dating/Relationship Violence
- Domestic Violence
- Stalking

Sexual misconduct may vary in severity. It can occur between strangers, or those in close relationships.

It is important for who have experienced sexual misconduct to understand their options to report, and to choose what resources are the best for them

Those impacted by sexual misconduct have <u>OPTIONS!</u> Reaching out for support, and utilizing the resources we have in place to assist those affected by sexual misconduct will not initiate a criminal investigation. The decision rests with the victim. PLU *encourages*, but does not require victims to file a formal complaint.

HOW TO FILE A REPORT

Sexual misconduct can be reported to the SRR Office or the Title IX Coordinator via email, phone, mail, or via the online incident report form. Any disclosure of such conduct to any PLU employee, or CS/RA/CD student employee that is not a confidential resource, will be reported to University authorities.

Once PLU obtains "ACTUAL KNOWLEDGE", meaning the University has been put on notice that an alleged sexual misconduct has occurred, the next steps are ...

- 1. Title IX Coordinator contacts and schedules a meeting with the Impacted Person
- 2. Campus resources and support measures are offered
- 3. Jurisdiction and reported misconduct defined
- 4. Process counseling and University response options discussed
- 5. Impacted Person decides how they want to move forward:

*File a Formal Complaint
Choose to pursue Informal
Resolution or start the Formal
Investigative Process

*Not file a Formal Complaint
Utilize campus supportive
measures and resources
